**Thought Of Our Passage:** "Faith Must Be Tested, A Faith That Can't Be Tested Surely Can't Be Trusted."

#### 10 Lessons From "The Famine Test"

**Genesis 12:10 Now Context -** We left off with Abraham building an altar. **Genesis 12:8** 

with Bethel on the west 10 miles north of Jerusalem. "The House of God" and Ai on the east; "Heap of Ruins"

and there he built an altar to the LORD ("Abram The Worshipper Of God")

**Genesis 12:9** continues to move but in the wrong direction towards Egypt.

Genesis 12:10 Now there was a famine in the land; (for the famine was severe in the land.) What we have here is the testing of our faith.

1. Verse 10 - Tests Often Follow Triumphs: Now there was a famine in the land; (for the <u>famine was severe in the land</u>.) Context - God Gave The Unconditional Abrahamic Covenant Promise to Abram

## **Genesis 12:2-3 Can God help Abram in a Famine?**

Tests Often Follow Triumphs: Illustrated in the history of Israel.

Delivered from Egypt than the Egyptian army chased them

(Exodus 12-15). Triumph was followed by testing.

**(Exodus 15:22-27).** God brought them through, faced another test: No Water

(Exodus 16) After that came hunger

(Exodus 17) and an attack from the Amalekites Tests follows triumphs.

After we have won a great Triumph of faith, expect the enemy to Tempt us or the Lord to Test us, or both.

- **1 Kings 17 Elijah** in a famine was provided for by ravens with meat and bread.
- 2. Verse 10 Unbelief, Don't Run From Your Testing: so Abram went down to Egypt to sojourn there, (Fails the test)

A Famine Comes, We Can – (1) Escape It, (2) Endure It, (3) Enlist It:

Human wisdom Versus God's wisdom.

**Egypt** – This represents the world and bondage in Scripture. **Isaiah 31:1 Canaan** – Our inheritance and blessings of God, trusting in the Lord.

3. Verse 10 - Abram Fails To Build An Altar: for the famine was severe in the land. Famines in Genesis 12:10; 26:1; 41:56 (Faith & Worship go together)

We don't read about Abraham in this period building and altar and praying and seeking God.

**for the famine was severe in the land.** It was not only a famine but severe. Another problem - **Genesis 12:6** 

When circumstances become difficult and we are in the furnace of testing, remain where God has placed us until He tells us to move.

4. Verses 11-13 - Scheming Replaced Trusting: that he said to Sarai his wife, "See now, I know that you are a beautiful woman;

**you are a beautiful 1<sup>st</sup> Time This Word Is Used In Scripture:** His wife Sari is now about 65 and is a beautiful woman. Sarai lived to 127; her age would be equivalent today as 30-40's, she gave birth at 90 which was equivalent to our 50's.

Genesis 12:12 and when the Egyptians see you,

Notice The Fear: leaving of God and now Abraham fears for his life. <a href="mailto:they">they</a> will say, 'This is his wife'; and they will kill me, but <a href="mailto:they will">they will</a> let you live. Up to this point God had said, "I Will" it was going to be God protecting <a href="mailto:Proverbs 29:25">Proverbs 29:25</a>

**Scheming Replaced Trusting: Genesis 12:13** 

Abram Lies: "Please say that you are my sister The half-truths which is a lie. Genesis 20:12 Sarai was his half-sister, but it was a lie. Sarai was the daughter of his father but not his mother. you are my sister (She was not his wife) Abram does it again in Genesis 20:1-18, and Isaac does so with his wife Rebekah Genesis 26:1-11

"A Half Truths Equal A Whole Lie."

"Please say that you are my sister How low a saint will go when we lose touch

5. Verse 13 - When Tested Don't Be Consumed With Yourself: so that it may go well with me because of you, and  $\underline{\text{that I}}$  may live on account of you."

As the husband, Abraham should have thought first of his wife and not of himself.

(N.L.T) 1 Peter 3:7; Ephesians 5:28-29

6. Verses 14-16 - Loss Outweighed Worldly Gain: Genesis 12:14-15

A husband out of the will of God can bring untold trouble to his wife and family.

Great Loss: and the woman was taken into Pharaoh's house.

Genesis 12:16 Abrams Worldly Gain: Therefore - (Sarai taken into Pharoah Harem) he treated Abram well for her sake; Here is Abraham being blessed over a lie and putting his bride in danger. Gifts of the king to the guardian of Sarai.

#### Being treated well! is no compensation for what you have lost!

Note **female servants** "Hagar" may be part of this group, Ishmael being the result. **female donkeys** were the desired transportation of the wealthy, **camels** domesticated were used by the super-wealthy, well-to-do. Here Abraham is becoming wealthy over a lie. Wealthy **Genesis 12:5,16** 

# 7. Verse 17 - Abram Becomes A Curse Instead Of A Blessing: Genesis 12:17

God Intervenes: But (God Stepped In) the LORD struck Pharaoh and his house with great plagues The Lord had said to Abraham Genesis 12:1-3 that he was going to bring blessing to the world. Genesis 12:3

Plagues - often used of skin diseases, maybe boils Exodus 9:9

**Jonah** ran from God, and it resulted in a storm that just about cost a crew their lives

**because of Sarai, Abram's wife.** Abram compromised and it hurt others. Sarai was unaffected by plagues, Egyptians asked questions and found out she was Abram's wife.

8. Verses 18-20 – Abram's Rebuke And Humiliation: "What is this you have done to me? Why did you not tell me that she was your wife?

Genesis 12:19 "Why did you say, 'She is my sister,' so that I took her for my wife? The Bible does not record the answer that Abraham gave.

Now then, here is your wife, <u>take</u> <u>her and go</u>." 4 Words spoken by Pharoah

Genesis 12:20 they escorted him away, with his wife and all that belonged to him.

9. Verses 1-2 - Separation Of Abram From Egypt: So Abram went up from Egypt to the Negev, We see that Abraham learned from his lesson. Separation:

**Genesis 13:2** Abraham became very wealthy through his bout with compromise.

Abram Snared By Egypt: The "Consequences" is that everything Abram received in Egypt later caused problems. Genesis 13:5-6

Hagar, the Egyptian maidservant, brought division and sorrow (Genesis 16)

Having had a taste of Egypt (the world), Lot started measuring everything by what he saw there (Genesis 13:10-11);

10. Verses 3-4 - Abram Returns To The Place Of Beginning: Genesis 13:3 from the Negev as far as Bethel, "The House Of God"

U-turn – Repentance, turn around: to the place where his tent had been at the beginning, We need to return to the Lord.

The church of Ephesus The Lord said these words: Revelation 2:5

between Bethel "The House of God" and Ai, "Heap of Ruins"

Genesis 13:4 Sacrifice: to the place of the altar, which he had made there formerly; Abraham had left the altar and the relationship that he once had.

- 1. After We Have Won A Great Triumph Of Faith, Expect The Enemy To Tempt Us Or The Lord To Test Us, Or Both. This Is The Only Way We Can Grow In Our Faith:
