Genesis 22:1-13

At 75, Abraham enrolled in the "School of Faith." Abraham was 100 when he had his son, Isaac, Now Abraham's greatest test was 116-130 years of age.

Abraham's Obedient Faith that Overcomes the Trials of Life

1. Verses 1-2 God's Command:

Genesis 22:1 Now it came about after these things, Context - What things? Genesis 21 That Isaac was born which was a promise 25 years in coming. Ishmael and Hagar were banished from the home. Abraham and Abimelech made a covenant Genesis 21:22-34 (After Blessings, Come Trials)

Genesis 21:34 The **many days** is about 15 years; some suggest as much as 30 years of time has elapsed between **Genesis 21:34** and **Genesis 22:1** Isaac was 37 when Sarah died.

tested - "to try, prove, put to the proof/test" **God** "Tests" to draw <u>upward</u> to "Prove" where we are, it is to <u>show us</u>, not <u>Him</u>. He wants to bring our **worth out!**

Satan "Tempts" to draw <u>downward</u>, to draw us away from God. To bring our **worst out!**

and said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." Abraham responded immediately. Joseph to Jacob – Genesis 37:13, Samuel 1 Samuel 3:4,6,8; Isaiah Isaiah 6:8, many others.

Genesis 22:2 He said, "Take now your son, your only son, We see now the reason that God had Ishmael leave the home of Abraham. "God wanted to paint the accurate picture of God the Father having only one son."

your son, your only son, whom you love, Isaac, John 3:16;

1 John 4:9; Acts 2:23

whom you <u>love</u>, Isaac, 1st Time the word "Love" is used in **Scripture.** The first mention is important! "Rule of first mentioned"

NT 1st Time in Matthew 3:17 My beloved Son, John 3:16

Love - word means "grown to love" (We can love the gift more than the giver)

Moriah - "Chosen by God, foreseen of Jehovah" Northeastern hill in Jerusalem. (2 Chronicles 3:1) Solomon would build the temple.

and offer him there as a burnt offering not slay "test" Not sinful James 1:13 God can't sin! (God wanted Abraham's heart)

"Our faith is not really tested until God asks us to bear what seems unbearable, do what seems unreasonable, and expect what seems impossible."

2. Verses 3-14 Abraham's Response:

Genesis 22:3 Prompt Obedience: So Abraham rose early in the morning and saddled his donkey, That is ready obedience. Psalm 119:60

Abraham Knew That God's Will Would Never Contradict God's Promise: so, he held on to the promise (Genesis 21:12)

Verses 3-10 There is no mention that God spoke to Abraham, the 3 days

and took two of his young men with him and Isaac his son; this is a picture of Gethsemane when Jesus with His disciples went to a lonely garden to pray.

and he split wood for the burnt offering, had to be wood, prepared for the sacrifice by bringing it.

Genesis 22:4 Sustained Obedience: On the third day He was living in Beersheba to Mount Moriah (Jerusalem) which was about 50 miles away. **Abraham stayed committed to his commitment.**

third day 3 days that Jesus was in the grave. Speaks of death, Abraham's death to himself.

saw the place from a distance. Abraham saw God as the resurrection and the life.

John 8:56

Genesis 22:5 Willing Obedience: "Stay here with the donkey, and I and the lad will go over there; Faith must go alone. It is just you and the Lord. Mark 14:33-35 Gethsemane

Call To Worship: and we will worship and return to you." Abraham knew that Isaac would die but God would bring him back, and he would return. (1st glimpse of the resurrection.) **Hebrews 11:17-19**

Worship – 1st Time the word Worship is used in Scripture. It is used in Abraham sacrificing His son, a love for a son. worship "to bow down"

Sacrifice, love, and obedience are equated with worship.

Genesis 22:6 Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on Isaac his son, Notice here that Isaac the sacrifice was carrying his own wood. John 19:17

The Son (Isaac/Christ) Took It Willingly, He Did Not Complain. John 10:17-18

and he took in his hand the fire and the knife. So the two of them walked on together. What a walk of dying this was!

Genesis 22:7 "Behold, the fire and the wood, but where is the lamb for the burnt offering?" there would have to be a sacrifice. John 1:29

Genesis 22:8 Abraham said, "God will provide for Himself ("see to Himself")

On what could Abraham depend or count on? Abraham could depend on the promise and provision of the Lord. Hebrews 11:17-19

So, the two of them walked on together. The Father and the Son acted together.

Genesis 18:4; Philippians 4:13

Genesis 22:9 and bound his son Isaac, and laid him on the altar on top of the wood. Isaac was 16-30 years of age, and Abraham 116-130 years of age. Hebrews 5:8

Genesis 22:10 Abraham stretched out his hand and took the knife to slay his son.

James 2:21-23

Genesis 22:11 angel of the LORD (Theophany, Jesus before Bethlehem)

Genesis 22:12 Abraham passed the test. Abraham had to be willing to give his son to God. **(Heart to God) Fear –** "respect, revere"

Genesis 22:13 a ram Notice it was not a lamb but a ram. The lamb was to be Jesus

<u>How Does God Provide For Us?</u> In ways that are usually quite natural.

"Substitutionary Atonement" That the price of redemption was paid by another. This was a ram, next time <u>The Lamb Of God!</u> **1 John 2:2**

Genesis 22:14 The LORD Will Provide Jehovah Jireh the word Provision - Pro-to vision-to see "The Lord will see to it" or "The Lord will be seen."

"In the mount of the LORD it will be provided." The provision was made at the cross

3. Verses 15-24 Covenant Reaffirmed:

Genesis 22:15 Then the angel of the LORD called to Abraham This is the **8**th **time that God speaks to Abraham, and it will be the last.**

Genesis 22:16 When we give our all, we will encounter blessings.

Genesis 22:17-18 (Jesus Christ **Galatians 3:16** Seed not seeds)

Genesis 22:19 He came back a different man than when he left.

It is interesting that Isaac is not mentioned again until **Genesis 24:62**

Verses 20-24 Preparation For Isaac's Bride Rebekah: Genesis 22:20-23

The roll call of the names of Abraham's brother's family Genesis 22:17

Application: We Will Be Tested But We Will Not Always Understand:

- **1. Focus On His Promise** Not Explanations, Faith Is Taking God At His Word.
- **2. Focus On God's Power –** Not Human Strength, We Will Face A Difficulty That Only God Can Take Us Through.
- **3. Focus On God's Purpose** Not Personal Desires, Character Over Comfort.
