- "that the soul of Jonathan was knit to the soul of David," Knit: "tied in a knot, melted."

The last time we heard of Jonathan, he was the hero of Israel, 1 Samuel 14:45.

Jonathan had to let that success and personal dreams of the throne go, in order to honor God and advance His kingdom.
