"relieve himself." – (KJV) 1 Samuel 24:3 – "and Saul went in to cover his feet": This is a euphemism for using the restroom.

Verses 4-7 – Saul Spared By David: 1 Samuel 24:4

David's Men Thought: Since David was Saul's enemy, then Saul must be David's enemy! (Wrong)

Proverbs 16:32

David was too wise in the truth of God's Word to interpret this event as a signal for him to kill Saul. Exodus 20:13

David saw it as an opportunity to show mercy and prove that his heart was right. Psalm 54:1

David Had A Tender Conscience: "David's conscience bothered him"

An act of disrespect that was a humiliation to Saul.

David will rebuke Saul: 1 Samuel 24:8-15; 1 Samuel 26:14-25.

David wrote Psalm 57:1-11 During this time.

"David persuaded his men with these words" – Literally "David tore his men apart with his words."

1 Samuel 24:16-17

Divine Level – "You are more righteous than I; for you have dealt well with me,"

Human Level – Return good for good

Demonic Level – "while I have dealt wickedly with you."

1 Samuel 24:18-20

"Now, behold, I know that you will surely be king," - Saul says, "Look, I know without a doubt that you are going to be King!"

Saul's crocodile tears are short lived because in 1 Samuel 26:1-6, Saul continues his manhunt for David.

1 Samuel 24:21

Saul does not repent; he is concerned about his (1) Family (2) Family name: (Not The Spiritual Or Israel's Condition).

1 Samuel 24:22

2 Samuel 9; 21:6-8

"David and his men went up to the stronghold." – David was not convinced by the tears and promises.

1 Peter 2:21-23

David was resting in the Lord, Allowing God To Fight His Battle: Romans 12:17-21.

- 1. David's Men Thought: Since David Was Saul's Enemy, Then Saul Must Be David's Enemy! (Wrong)
- 2. Proverbs 16:32 "He who is slow to anger is better than the mighty, And he who rules his spirit, than he who captures a city."
