1 Samuel 1-7 – The Ministry Of Samuel: Samuel – "Heard of God" and "Asked of God."

Samuel's office included:

1. Verses 1-5 - God's Judgment On A False God:

1 Samuel 5:1

"Now the Philistines took the ark of God" - 1 Samuel 4:19-22

"Ebenezer" – literally, "stone of help" Western hills of Israel.

"to Ashdod" – literally, "ravager"; 30 miles southwest of Ebenezer.

1 Samuel 5:2

Dagon – corn – fertility, "the fish god" – waistline up, he was a man; waistline down, a fish. (Male Mermaid) Dagon was the national god of Philistines – The nautical god of the Philistines – They would give tribute and thanks to him for producing fertility of the ocean, etc.

Romans 1:18-25

"set it by Dagon" - literally, "at his side,"

1 Samuel 5:3

At the arrest of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane: John 18:6

Psalm 115:1-18

Psalm 115:3 – "in the Heavens" – sovereignty

Psalm 115:4 - "Silver & Gold" - "work of man's hands"

Psalm 115:5 - "Mouth - can't speak - eyes can't see"

Psalm 115:6 - "Ears - cannot hear - noses can't smell"

Psalm 115:7 – "Hands cannot feel – feet cannot walk ... can't make a sound with throat"

Psalm 115:8 – "Those who make them will become like them,"

Psalm 115:9-18 - He is a Shield Help

1 Samuel 5:4

"cut off" – not broken off – but severed with deliberate care, and placed contemptuously upon the threshold.

"head" - symbol of reason - intellect

"hands" - activity - service

"Just a trunk of Dagon was left" – God stripped Dagon to expose him for what he really is, nothing! Empty

1 Samuel 5:5

2. Verses 6-12 - God's Judgment On The Philistines:

1 Samuel 5:6

Ashdod – "ravager"

"hand of the Lord was heavy on the Ashdodites" – "grievous, burdensome, difficult, hard"

"smote them with tumors" – KJV – "emrods"; Heb. – opel; refers to tumors or swellings of the rectal area. (KJV) 1 Samuel 5:9 – "they had <u>emerods in their secret parts</u>." This word that was used was considered not fit for public reading in the synagogue.

1 Samuel 5:7

Verses 8-9 - God Versus The Leaders: 1 Samuel 5:8

"So they sent and gathered all the lords of the Philistines to them and said," – The five key cities of the Philistines were Ashdod, Gaza, Ashkelon, Gath, and Ekron, and each had a ruler or "lord". 1 Sam 6:16-17

Gath – Literally, "winepress", Revelation 19:15-16

(Philistines had no desire to relinquish the Ark to the Lord!)

1 Samuel 5:9

"great confusion;" – "uproar, destruction, trouble, tumult, vexation, or agitate greatly, destroy, make a noise."

1 Samuel 4:9

It is a sad condition when we allow our sin and its consequences to be poured out upon our children, grandchildren.

<u>Verses 10-12 – God Versus The Ekronites</u>: 1 Samuel 5:10

"So they sent the ark of God to Ekron." – The word means "eradication, a primitive root; to pluck up (especially by the roots); figurative to exterminate, dig down, root up."

There is the truth that if we reject the God of grace, we will meet the God of justice. John 3:17-21

1 Samuel 5:11

"They sent therefore and gathered all the lords of the Philistines and said," – All the leaders of the Philistines gathered to figure out what should take place.

"Send away the ark of the God of Israel, and let it return to <u>its own place</u>, that it may not kill us and our people." – Send it back to where it came from.

"For there was a deadly confusion throughout the city;" – God killed a number of citizens ("deadly confusion, destruction"); "a dismay of death."

1 Samuel 5:12

2 Cor. 7:10

Application:

- 1. God Is Still In Control When The Enemy Has Seemingly Captured The Glory.
- 2. God's People May Experience The Loss Of A Battle, But God Will Give The Ultimate Victory Of The War.
