Theme of Luke: "Jesus Christ The Perfect Man" Written to Greeks

Luke 1:1-4:13 The Introduction Of The Son Of Man:

Thought of Our Passage: "God Becoming Flesh Was Foretold By The Prophets, Announced By Angels And Witnessed By Man."

- 1. Verses 1-7 The Birth Of Jesus
- 2. Verses 8-14 The Birth Announcement
- 3. Verses 15-20 The Birth Testimony

1. Verses 1-7 The Birth Of Jesus

Luke 2:1 Now in those days - Context - A reference to the "days of John the Baptist" that Luke just spoke about in Luke 1, Matthew 1:18-20

a decree went out from Caesar Augustus,

He was the great-nephew of Julius Caesar. First Caesar to be called **"Augustus"** which means "holy, or revered" At that time, was used only of the gods.

"The baby Mary carried was not a Caesar who would become a god, but the true God who had become a man!"

Luke 2:2 first census taken – This was a census to find the ages of and the numeric break down of the Roman empire. Tax

Luke 2:3 Each person would need to return to their place of birth then pay a tax in that city.

Luke 2:4 from the city of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem - About 90-mile journey.

Micah foretold 700 years before Jesus' birth. Micah 5:2; Proverbs 21:1

Bethlehem - means "house of bread" John 6:35

Jesus came from the "House of bread" to be "the bread of life" (Fulfilling The Davidic Covenant 2 Samuel 7)

Luke 2:5 who was <u>engaged to him</u>, (Not married yet) and was with child. This fills us in on God's plan.

Luke 2:6 We see how God leads them to the **right place**, God leads them at the **right time**.

Luke 2:7 she gave birth to her <u>first-born</u> son; Mary had other children, sons and daughters – Mark 6:3; Luke 8:19-21; Acts 1:14; Galatians 1:19; Jude 1:1

her first-born son; This is called "The Virgin Birth" Matthew 1:18, 21; Luke 1:34-35

This is called the **"First Advent of the Son of God"** (His First Coming)

The Incarnation of the Son of God. (God in flesh and blood body)

The Virgin Birth of the Son of God. (Mary conceived of the Holy Spirit.)

The promise was first made back in Genesis 3:15; 1 Peter 2:24

she wrapped Him in cloths, - These were strips and pieces of cloth that were wrapped around a child to keep warm and to protect and keep their limbs straight.

and laid Him in a manger, - That is a feeding trough. Made of stones, others of wood.

The manger spoke of Jesus' lifestyle and mission.

Lowly Birth - lowly life: He did not come to be served but to serve

Lowly Death - He would die the death of a criminal: He would die in between two thieves.

Jesus did not wear sparkling remnant: At the cross, they gambled for His garment.

Jesus did not wear a gold crown - But did wear a crown of thorns:

The King did not ride a horse on His triumphal entry - He came on a donkey:

because there was no room for them in the inn. There never seems to be room for Jesus. **John 1:11**

2. Verses 8-14 The Birth Announcement

Luke 2:8 same region there were some shepherds - Shepherds were considered the bottom of the social structure.

Why did God choose shepherds?

- Jesus is the Lamb of God He was to be slaughtered for the sins of the world.
- **2.** Jesus is also called "The Great Shepherd of the Sheep" He is the great shepherd that would lay down His life for the sheep.
- 3. Shepherds are a picture of needy mankind "God used earth's lowest to do God's highest"

Luke 2:9 the glory of the Lord shone around them; splendor, brightness of God.

and they were terribly frightened. What they saw was out of their realm.

Luke 2:10 "Do not be afraid; for behold, I bring you (The angel let them know this was a good encounter) good news – "gospel"

of great joy - Will produce a joy that will last for all of eternity.

which will be for all the people; These "Good News" - the gift is for all.

Luke 2:11 city of David (Bethlehem) there has been born for you a Savior, "rescuer" who is Christ - "chosen one" the Lord - "God Himself"

What does "All" mean? It simply means for all people. has been born for you

"Salvation is God's greatest work which meets man's greatest need, forgiveness of sin"

Luke 2:12-13 (heavenly host - "army announcing peace"
Tens of thousands of angels praising God!) Hebrews 1:6; Deut 32:43

Notice that the praise to God continues in this next chapter. **Elizabeth, Mary, Zacharias**, now **angels.** Break forth with praise. Praise of God is universal, in all times.

Luke 2:14 "Glory to God in the highest, God exalted to the highest heavens, beyond the earth.

And on earth peace among men - 27 BC. The Roman government had legislated the "Pax Romana". The Roman temple (Temple of War) the god **Janus** was closed.

with whom He is pleased." "among men of whom God's favor rests" those who place their faith and trust in God!

3. Verses 15-20 The Birth Testimony

Luke 2:15

The Shepherds Listened & Believed: the shepherds began saying to one another, "Let us go straight to Bethlehem then, Luke 1:52 <u>has</u> exalted those who were humble.

and see this thing "this word"

The Shepherds determined to go at the **Right Time**, (Now!) not commanded

The Shepherds went to the **Right Place** (Bethlehem)

The Shepherds went for the **Right Purpose**, (See this thing, this word!)

Luke 2:16 So they came in a hurry - Quick Obedience

Shepherds Went To See: found their way to Mary and Joseph, and the baby as He lay in the manger.

What a Reward - to find that God's Word is true: Fulfilled word Luke 2:12

Luke 2:17 they made known the statement - Shepherds were the first preachers of Jesus Christ.

When we become receivers, we also become givers.

which had been told them about this Child. It was a true statement; we can stand on the Word of God. (There was the child as described by the angel)

Luke 2:18 And all who heard it wondered (Amazed, 13 times in Luke)

Luke 2:19 But (Contrast) Mary treasured all these things, Mary was not vocal, she kept it inside! "to keep in mind lest we forget"

pondering them in her heart. "to throw together, to bring together"

Luke 2:20

Shepherds Go: shepherds went back

Shepherds Tell: went back, glorifying and praising God The glory went to the Lord not man.

Praising God For All He Has Done: praising God for all that they had heard and seen,

Application:

- **1.** The Child Mary Carried Was Not A Caesar Who Would Become A god, But The True God Who Had Become A Man.
- 2. Believing That Jesus Is The Son Of God Who Came In The Flesh Is Not Only Orthodoxy, But Necessary For Salvation. Luke 2:11
- **3.** The Announcement Of Jesus' Birth Was First Made To Shepherds. This Reveals God's Desire To Save All People Because All People Are In Need Of Salvation.
