2 Kings 6: 24-25

"There was a great famine in Samaria;" – Leviticus 26:26, 29; Deuteronomy 28:17, 48.

"they besieged it," – Leviticus 26:17, 25, 33, 36-39; Deuteronomy 28:25-26, 49-52.

"until a donkey's head was sold for eighty shekels of silver," – 2 lbs. of silver.

"and a fourth of a kab (half pint) of dove's dung (nickname chickpeas, seed pods) for five shekels of silver." -2 oz. of silver.

2 Kings 6:26-29 – Cannibalism

Joram's father, Ahab, called Elijah "the one who troubled Israel", 1 Kings 18:17.

2 Kings 6:32

"Do you see how this son of a murderer has sent to take away my head?" – 1 Kings 18:4. They also killed their neighbor Naboth, 1 Kings 21.

2 Kings 6:33

2 Kings 7:1

Verses 1-2 – Good News From The Lord: "Then Elisha said, 'Listen to the word of the LORD; thus says the LORD,'"

2 Kings 21:10 – "the Lord spoke through His servants the prophets."

"Tomorrow about this time a measure of fine flour (7 quarts) will be sold for a shekel, and two measures of barley (13 quarts) for a shekel,"

2 Kings 7:2

3. 2 Kings 7:3-20 - The Deliverance:

2 Kings 7:3 – Being Lepers, they were outcasts, Leviticus 13:36.

2 Kings 7:4 - "let us go over ("to desert") to the camp of the Arameans."

2 Kings 7:5-7

The Syrians had left their camp as it was and fled twenty-five miles to the Jordan River, scattering their possessions as they ran, 2 Kings 7:15.

- 1. King Joram Called Elisha "My Father" 2 Kings 6:21 (his master); Later In 2 Kings 6:32, He Wanted To Take Off Elisha's Head. Why Such Duplicity? James 1:8 "being a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways."
- 2. King Joram Wanted To Kill The Syrians, But Elisha "Killed Them With Kindness." Matthew 5:7 "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy.
- 3. The Four Lepers Found The Syrian Camp Unoccupied And Filled With Resources. They Said in 2 Kings 7:9 "We are not doing right. This day is a day of good news, but we are keeping silent;" These Same Words Can Apply To Believers Today About Sharing "The Good News Of The Gospel."
