Abuse of power, greed, gross injustice and meanness!

2 Samuel 12:5

David Had Taken The Man's Lamb – Adultery – Leviticus 20:10

Murder – Leviticus 24:17

David was rash and was going to kill Nabal for not sharing food.

1 Samuel 25:13

1 Samuel 25:22

1 Samuel 25:33

David didn't seem to realize that He was the rich man, Uriah was the poor man, and Bathsheba was the ewe lamb he had stolen.

2 Samuel 12:6

Exodus 22:1

Of all blindness, the worst kind is that which makes us blind to ourselves.

Verses 7-9 – The Verdict:

2 Samuel 12:7

Hebrews 4:12

Verses 7-8 – David Forgot The Goodness Of God: "It is I who anointed you king over Israel and it is I who delivered you from the hand of Saul."

2 Samuel 12:8

Verse 9 – David Despised God's Word: 2 Samuel 12:9

"You have struck down Uriah the Hittite with the sword," – Committed Murder; David's hands had blood on them.

"have taken his wife to be your wife," – Committed adultery

"and have killed him with the sword of the sons of Ammon." – Bearing false witness, used the enemy to do the killing.

Verses 10-12 – The Sentence:

2 Samuel 12:10 – "the sword shall never depart from your house," – God repaid David "in kind"

2 Samuel 12:11

David's Own Family Would Bring Evil Against Him: "Thus says the LORD, 'Behold, I will raise up evil against you from your own household;'"

1. Bathsheba's baby died.
2. His sons Amnon, Absalom, and Adonijah were slain, 2 Samuel 13:29; 18:14-15; 1 Kings 2:25.
3. David's daughter Tamar was raped by her half-brother, 2 Samuel 13.
4. Absalom's rebellion – David was forced to flee Jerusalem and live in the wilderness.

"I will even take your wives before your eyes and give them to your companion, and he will lie with your wives in broad daylight." – 2 Samuel 16:22

David, A Man After God's Own Heart: "Then David said to Nathan, 'I have sinned against the LORD.'"

2 Samuel 12:26 – This is a battle that started in 2 Samuel 10:1-14; finally finished the battle.
