### 1. Verses 1-14 - Love To Lust:

2 Samuel 13:1

"Now it was after this" - 2 Samuel 12:26-31

"Absalom" – 2 Samuel 13-19, focus on the "Absalom Story".

"the son of David had a beautiful sister whose name was Tamar," – Both Tamar and Absalom were noted for their physical beauty, 2 Samuel 13:1; 14:25.

"and Amnon the son of David loved her." – "Amnon" – was the oldest of David's sons.

"loved her." - Leviticus 18:9-11; 20:17; Deuteronomy 27:22

2 Samuel 13:2-3

"But Amnon had a friend (Cousin) whose name was Jonadab, the son of Shimeah, David's brother;" – Jonadab was Amnon's cousin, 1 Samuel 16:9.

2 Samuel 13:4

A true godly friend would have stepped in and shared God's Word on the subject.

2 Samuel 13:5-6

Proverbs 25:26

- 2 Samuel 13:7 David was known for his wisdom and keen insight,
- 2 Samuel 14:17, 20.
- 2 Samuel 13:8-14

### 2. Verses 15-22 - Lust To Hatred:

2 Samuel 13:15

This was not love; it was lust and passion.

True love would never violate another person's body just to satisfy selfish appetites.

2 Samuel 13:16-17

"Now throw this <u>woman</u> out of my presence," – The word "woman" is not in the Hebrew text, so Amnon was saying, "Throw this thing out!"

2 Samuel 13:18-20

"been with you" - was a euphemism for "gone to bed with you."

But if Absalom was so concerned about his sister, why didn't he warn her to stay away from Amnon?

"He is your brother" – means, "If it were any other man, I would avenge you immediately; but since it's your brother, I'll have to be patient and wait for an opportunity."

#### 3. Verses 23-36 - Hatred To Murder:

2 Samuel 13:23

"Now it came about after <u>two full years</u>" – For two years Absalom waited to avenge the rape of his sister.

"Baal-hazor," – about fourteen miles North of Jerusalem.

2 Samuel 13:24-28

2 Samuel 13:29 - "mules", which were considered a "royal animal";

2 Samuel 18:9; 1 Kings 1:33, 38, 44

Verses 30-36 – What Happens In Jerusalem: 2 Samuel 13:30-31.

Verse 32-33 - The Voice Of Reason.

2 Samuel 13:34-36

#### 4. Verses 37-39 - Murder To Exile:

2 Samuel 13:37

"Now Absalom fled and went to Talmai the son of Ammihud, the king of Geshur." – Absalom fled 80 miles northeast.

"And David mourned for his son every day." – Back in Jerusalem, David mourned over his firstborn son Amnon.

2 Samuel 13:38-39

"The heart of King David longed to go out to Absalom;" – It was five years before father and son saw each other face-to-face, 2 Samuel 13:38; 14:28.

## Application:

- 1. David is the example for a parent that there is no private morality. Behavior and attitudes have repercussions in the family.
- 2. Anybody in our lives who makes it easy for us to sin is certainly not much of a friend.

- 3. True love would never violate another person's body just to satisfy selfish appetites, nor would true love try to persuade someone to disobey the law of God.
- 4. The problem with revenge is that it doesn't really solve any problems. Eventually it turns around and hurts the perpetrator.
