“When King David came to Bahurim,” – East of Jerusalem on the road to the Jordan valley. 2 Samuel 15:30

“Shimei” – root: “to hear intelligently, often with implication of attention, obedience.”

Shimei – is in violation of Scripture, Exodus 22:28.
