<u>2 Samuel</u> – David is the figure of the book. We see David's in his national Triumphs, and David in his personal Trials.

<u>1 & 2 Samuel</u> – Were one book in the Hebrew Bible, was called "The book of Samuel" or "Samuel"

<u>Samuel</u> – "The name of God" "Heard of God" and "Asked of God"

Samuel's office included

- 3. Samuel as Prophet 3:20

When Written – The book covers 40 ½ years. 2 Samuel 1-5 is 7 ½ years in Hebron over Judah: 2 Sam 6-24 is 33 years in Jerusalem.

Written about 900 BC. The events Began 1011 BC – 971 BC completed.

<u>Where it was Written</u> –

<u>Purpose</u> – To give a record of the Triumph's and Trials of David, the man after God's own heart.

2 Samuel 1 David's Sorrow Over Saul's Death: • 2 Sam 1:11-12

This reveals the heart of God's man!

Note that an Amalekite brought the news and claimed to be the one who finally took Saul's life. Had Saul obeyed the Lord in 1 Sam. 15 and slain all of the Amalekites, this would not have happened. The sin we fail to slay is the one that slays us. • *Deut.* 25:17-19

1. David did not consult the Lord; he consulted his political leaders:

2. David's next mistake was to ignore God's Word. Instead of asking the Levites to bear the ark on their shoulders (• Num. 3:27-31; 4:15; 7:9; 10:21), he followed the worldly example of the Philistines and put the ark on a new cart.

3. A man who was not a Levite touched the ark (see • Num. 4:15). God had to judge him immediately or else sacrifice His glory and permit His Word to be violated.

Lo-debar which means "*no pasture."* That is a fitting description of this present world—no pasture, no place for the souls to be satisfied. Sinners are hungry and thirsty, but this world and its pleasures cannot satisfy.

It was not a passionate youth who deliberately walked into this sin, but a man of God who had now reached middle age.

1. David was self-confident, after enjoying victories and prosperity;

2. David was disobedient, staying home when he should have been on the battlefield;

3. David was idle, lying in bed in the evening;

4. David was self-indulgent, giving freedom to his desires when he should have been disciplining himself;

5. David was careless, allowing his eyes to wander and yielding to the "lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes" (• *1 John 2:16*). The Christian soldier must never lay aside the armor

The sword never did depart from David's household: the <u>baby died</u>; Absalom <u>killed Amnon</u>, who had ruined Tamar (chap. 13); then Joab killed <u>Absalom</u> (18:9-17); and <u>Adonijah</u> was slain by Benaiah (1 Kings 2:24-25). Fourfold! Add to these trials the awful ruin of Tamar, the shameful treatment of David's wives by Absalom (12:11; 16:20-23), plus the rebellion of Absalom.

2 Samuel 24 The Sin of the Spirit: (The Census Taken) That the adultery with <u>Bathsheba was a sin of the flesh</u>, the <u>census was a sin of the spirit</u>. The result was 70,000 died. We must keep in mind that a census that praised men would never glorify God. • 1 Chronicles 21

Application

1. We never outgrow temptation

2. God graciously gives time to repent

He gave David more than nine months to deal with his sins and make matters right. "Seek the Lord while He may be found."

3. Sins of the spirit do great damage

All sin is wicked and should be avoided, to be sure, but we must realize that the Bible repeatedly condemns stubborn pride.

4. Our sins involve others:

Seventy thousand people died because David disobeyed the Lord.

5. True confession is a costly thing:

True confession involves facing sin honestly and obeying God's Word regardless of the price we must pay.

6. God will forgive and bring blessing:

Let us put ourselves into the hands of the Lord, for great are His mercies toward us!
