# Series "Knowing The Exact Truth" "Learning From Children" Luke 18:15-17 Study-74

#### **Instructions to Fathers to bring their children to Jesus!**

The passage reverses and reveals that Fathers and Mothers Can Receive Instruction through their children: <u>Being As A Child</u>, <u>Receiving As A Child</u>.

Context - Luke 18 The Disciples' Call To Radical Faith: Verses 15-17 Childlike Faith, Adults need to learn from children about the type of faith that God desires if we are going to enter the kingdom of God!

**The Thought Of Our Passage:** "Dedicated Kingdom Living Begins With Childlike Faith And Continues With Open Invitations To All Children"

- 1. Verse 15 Blessing Of A Child
- 2. Verse 16 Being As A Child
- 3. Verse 17 Receiving As A Child

#### 1. Verse 15 Blessing Of A Child:

**Luke 18:15 And Context** – Jesus told a parable about the "Right Heart In Prayer" **Verses 9-14** Repentant Faith He told of the Pharisee and the Tax-collector that went into the temple to pray. **Luke 18:14** 

All three Gospels recorded children coming to Jesus Matthew 19:13-15; Mark 10:13-16; Luke 18:15-17 But Matthew, and Mark record that Jesus had just spoken about divorce, now He speaks about children.

**Context** – Luke now Joins **Matthew** and **Mark** since breaking away back in **Luke 9:51,** All 3 Gospels recorded this which follow's the account of the rich young ruler.

**they** were bringing even their babies Who is the "they?" they – Greek pronoun is masculine, includes the fathers. Other gospels, the parents of children that brought them. Parents brought their children to Jesus.

In the Jewish culture the father was responsible for the spiritual training of the children. Luke records this, they brought their children to Jesus.

their babies to Him Mark 10:13 children - Matthew 19:13 children, here babies "babe, (young) infant" (under 12 months) children from infants to mature one's. (Fathers had to literally carry their children to Jesus!)

so that He would touch them, Matthew said, "Lay His hands on them and pray." We see this practice back in Genesis 9:26-27 Noah blessed Shem and Japheth. Genesis 26 Isaac blesses Jacob, Esau, Genesis 48:14 when Jacob laid his hands on Joseph's boys to give them a blessing.

The Jewish Elders used to pray this, "that the child would be famous in the Law, faithful in marriage and abundant in good works"

#### Parents Should Bring Their Children To Jesus:

How do we bring our children to Jesus?

- Bring Thru Prayer We have the responsibility to pray for them. To daily bring them before the Lord in prayer. (Context two parables involving prayer)
- **2. Bring Thru Instruction -** We are to train them, to bring them up, in the discipline and instruction in the Lord.

Ephesians 6:4;\_Deuteronomy 6:4-9

**Common life experiences** 

A child that has questions about God (They all do) we need to encourage, through helping them to find the answers.

**3. Bring Thru Example -** We can pray for them, we can teach them, but it can all be for nothing if we are living hypocritical lives.

**Deuteronomy 6:4-6** 

We can't take our children where we have not gone ourselves.

Proverbs 1:8 Hear, my son, your father's instruction,

The word **rebuked** - "to reprove, censure severely, reprimanded them, charge one with wrong" As the waves of children and parents were coming to Jesus, the disciples were systematically chewing them out!

**Possible Reason - Disciples saw children as little importance:** 

Apostate Judaism that taught you earned your way to heaven by good works. Children couldn't do that.

Possible Reason - Protecting Jesus who was possibly exhausted:

Mark 10:14 But when Jesus saw this, He was indignant and said to them,

Only Mark Notes Jesus Emotion! But when Jesus saw this, He was indignant - Literally "much grieved, to be very grieved, very angry, irate to severely reprimand"

The disciples may have had the **best of motives**, **but still wrong!** 

#### 2. Verse 16 Being As A Child:

**Luke 18:16 But Jesus called for them,** Jesus calls (invites) the children to come to Him, children that were pushed way! (Bring the babies)

saying, "Permit the children to come to Me, and do not hinder them, Jesus could be proclaimed as "Jesus The Lover of Children"

A pastor made this observation, "No one knows the age of the youngest person in Hell!"

Babies before they reach accountability for believing or not believing, are under special divine care. 2 Samuel 12:23 "I will go to him"

to such as these. Jesus did not say, "the kingdom belongs to the children He was holding" such as these "those who are like the little ones"

**As A Child, Helplessness/Dependence** – every child regardless of what country, regardless of poverty/wealth, regardless of their background. For years a child is helpless and dependent on others. Without the help of an adult, they will not make it!

**Context** – Jesus just gave a **parable of a Pharisee who trusted in himself.** God became his debtor because he did it all, without the help of God.

All three gospels follow up this incident with the story of "The Rich Young Ruler" Luke 18:18 what shall I do to inherit eternal life?"

Children Are A Powerful Illustration That Salvation Is By Grace.

#### 3. Verse 17 Receiving As A Child:

**Luke 18:17 "Truly"** Literally "This is of a great truth, listen up this is important"

We Must Enter The Kingdom Like A Child: receive the kingdom of God like a child How do we do that? Jesus does not give the specifics of

what it is to be like a child but leaves it up to us to study and learn from our children.

will not enter it at all." Greek double negative - "shall never, never, enter"

## What Characteristics Can We Learn From Children To Enter His Kingdom?

- 1. Children Are Great Receivers -
- 2. Children's Belief/Trust If Dad or Mom said it then they will believe it.
- Humility Children know their limitations. They possess humble dependence knowing that their dependence is upon another. Luke 9:46-48
- 4. Children Express Love -

- 1. Parents have The Awesome Responsibility To Bring Their Children To Jesus. We Bring Them Thru Prayer, Instruction, And Example.
- 2. Jesus Christ Is The Advocate For Little Children. Before A Child Is Accountable For Their Actions, They Have A Special Position Of Belonging To The Kingdom Of God.
- 3. Lesson In Discipleship: Children Are Loved By Jesus So We Should Never Hinder Children From Coming To Jesus:
- 4. In Order For Adults To Enter The Kingdom Of God We Must Learn From Children; Being As A Child And Receiving As A Child.
