# Series Psalm 23 "The Lord Is My Shepherd" "The Lord Is My Shepherd" Psalm 23:1-6 Part-8

**What Are "The Psalms?"** – The word **Psalm** "a poem sung to musical accompaniment; a song sung to the accompaniment of a plucked instrument"

**The Author of Psalm 23** is called a "Psalm of David" written 3000 years ago. David was a shepherd.

**Book: "A Shepherd Looks at Psalm 23 By Phillip Keller (Was a Shepherd)** 

**The Thought Of Our Passage:** "The LORD Is My Shepherd, And Host Since The Lord Is My Shepherd - I Shall Not Want:"

#### **Verses 1-4 The Lord My Shepherd:**

## 1. I Shall Not Want: Psalm 23:1 The LORD is my shepherd, I shall not want.

**The LORD** — Note that in the title **LORD**, each letter is capitalized. In Hebrew, it is four letters, **YHWH**, "The Name!" Probably pronounced Yah weh in English. It is "Jehovah" which means, "To Be, the Becoming One, the Self Existent One, Timeless, Self-sufficiency"

**Jehovah** – First disclosed to Moses in the burning bush **Exodus 3:13-15** 

"The Name" is repeated more than 4000 times in the rest of the OT.

The Bible contains "Seven Compound Names of God."

All seven are in Psalm 23

The Best Known is - Jehovah Raah (Psalms 23:1) "The LORD our Shepherd"

My Shepherd: Psalm 23:1 The LORD is my shepherd, I shall not want.

The Bible likens His people to sheep throughout Scripture. Psalm 28:9; Psalm 78:52; 80:1

Jesus Is Called "The Good Shepherd": John 10:11, 14

Sheep Are Individuals/With Shared Characteristics.
Sheep are Dumb, Dependent, Defenseless, Dirty, and lack Direction.

<u>I Shall Not Want:</u> **I shall not want.** The word **want –** "not lacking, not deficient, in proper care". It is also the idea of being utterly contented, so as not to crave for a thing." The Key To Psalm 23 "Since The Lord Is Your Shepherd, You Want Not!"

There are 17 personal singular pronouns in Psalm 23

#### 2. I Shall Not Want For Rest:

**Psalm 23:2** Literally, "He makes me to lie down in pastures of tender grass. He leads me beside the waters of rest."

# The Shepherd's two pronouns preceding the two verbs — "He makes me" & "He leads me"

**1.** He Makes Me: **He makes me lie down** in green pastures; It is the Great Shepherd that knows what the needs of the sheep are. (Being Healthy Means Resting)

He <u>makes me</u> lie down
The very nature of sheep does not allow them to lie down –
to experience rest.

2. He Leads Me: He leads me beside quiet waters.

"Waters of rest" "place of repose, a resting place, a quiet place" Sheep now need to drink. They have eaten, and now, they are in need of water.

Mankind is spiritually thirsty, and we keep drinking from the wrong sources of water. Jeremiah 2:13

**Rest From Fear:** Sheep are timid animals.

**Rest From Friction:** Rivalry, tension, and cruel competition within the flock.

Rest From Flies: For us it is "You Bug Me!" or "This Bug's Me!"

Rest From Famine: Need fresh pastures. Shepherd provides for us.

## 3. I Shall Not Want For Restoration: Psalm 23:3 He restores my soul;

- 1. I Need Restoration restores my soul;
- 2. Shepherd Gives Restoration He restores my soul;
- 1. I Need Restoration: restores my soul; Scripture repeatedly notes we are like strayed sheep, 1 Peter 2:25
- 2. Shepherd Gives Restoration: **restores my soul**; is a Hebrew idiom which means "brings me to repentance, or (conversion)" **soul** "life" since the metaphor is that of shepherding the words probably mean, "the Lord restores me back to physical health, (or salvation) He brings me back, the shepherd brings back a lost sheep, a cast sheep. He revives me through repentance.

Psalm 42:11;119: 176 "The Lord our shepherd will get us back on our feet!"

Sheep drift off, and so do we. We can get lost in our day-to-day activities. Isaiah 53:6

# 4. I Shall Not Want For Guidance: Psalm 23:3

- 1. Guides Me
- 2. Guides In Righteous Paths

#### 3. Guides For His Name Sake

<u>1. Guides Me:</u> He guides me in the paths We like sheep must have guidance.

John 10:4 he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him

Of all the animals that God has created sheep are unique in that they can't survive without a shepherd.

2. Guides In Righteous Paths: paths of righteousness — "not just a straight way, a righteous way, we stray by sinning, but God leads us into upright moral paths" righteousness — "in the right" wickedness — "in the wrong"

The phrases "hear His voice" and "harden not your hearts" are used four times in Scripture Psalm 95:7-8; Hebrews 3:7-8, 15; 4:7

3. Guides For His Name Sake: For His name's sake. "for His purpose and His glory" term His name's "the nature and the character of God" His character is holy, 'for the sake of showing His abilities and His character'

**Reason For His Leading:** When I am being led in 'paths of righteousness', it's for the sake of demonstrating God's abilities and character. (We Can Witness God on display!)

# 5. I Shall Not Want For Safety: Psalm 23:4

#### Our passage reveals three truths about our Shepherd:

1. The Purpose of The Shepherd: (Guides) Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, The shepherd leads us through the valley. When the shepherd leads through a Barren Place it is with the purpose of guiding us to a Better Place.

Picture an image of the growing dependence of a sheep to the shepherd, as he leads in the summer and winter seasons. (Safety)

**the valley of the shadow of death,** translated, "deep gloom, the glen of deep gloom" this is a Hebrew idiom for "dark, difficult, bitter experiences of life." The word "death" is not in the Hebrew, it is "Deepest darkest valley" It speaks of those difficult, dangerous experiences that bring fear to our hearts.

Why Does God Lead Us Through Deep Dark Valleys? (Three Reasons)

- 1. The Valleys Purify Us: Job 23:10; Psalm 66:10 Used To Discipline Us When We Have Disobeyed God's Will Psalm 119:67 <u>Before I was afflicted I went astray</u>, But now I keep Your word.
- 2. The Valleys Perfect Us: (Bring To Maturity) Ephesians 4:13

# Trials Force Us To See Our Helplessness, Making Us Dependent Upon God - 2 Corinthians 12:9

- 3. The Valleys Prepare Us For Service: Moses, David, Peter, John, Paul
- 2. The Presence of The Shepherd: **I fear no evil, for <u>You are with me</u>**; Note a transition in the Psalm as to how David has been addressing God.

Verses — 1-3 David has spoken of the Lord, "He" "His" Now in Verses — 4-6 David speaks to the Lord "You" 4 for <u>You</u> are with me; <u>Your</u> rod and <u>Your</u> staff, they comfort me. Nothing brings us closer to God than when "I walk through the valley of the shadow of death,"

3. The Power of The Shepherd: Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me.

**Shepherds Protection: Your rod** (Club) "used to correct and to protect his sheep" (to protect us from the powers of evil)

Shepherds Care: and Your staff, (Crook) Identifies The Shepherd As The Shepherd "used to lift and restore the sheep" (Draw you close to Him)

Staff – Drawing Sheep Together – Staff – Guiding The Sheep –

#### 6. I Shall Not Want For Provision: Psalm 23:5

**God's Provision Is Described Three Times.** 

<u>1. Prepare A Table:</u> You prepare a table from the <u>shepherd of sheep</u> to that of the <u>host for his guests Verses – 5-6 The Lord My Host:</u>

The Bible reveals that there is a continual feast from Genesis -Revelation. Covenant meals and meals of fellowship are recorded throughout Scripture. With an open invitation! (Table, Feast is of Salvation)

God Meets Our Physical Needs: Matthew 6:11; Philippians 4:19

**God Meets Our Spiritual Needs: Ephesians 1:3 (Ephesians 1:4-14)** 

**in the presence of my enemies;** In David's day, treaties were made with enemies. After treaties were made, it was followed by a meal. God has always been faithful.

A Table Of Restoration: Peter at the last supper was told by Jesus that he would flee and deny Jesus three times. John 21:12-15

2. Anointed My Head: You have anointed my head with oil;

God's Pledge Of The Holy Spirit: 2 Corinthians 1:21-22

**Holy Spirit Convicts of Sin: John 16:8** 

**Holy Spirit Teaches Us: 1 John 2:27** 

3. My Cup Overflows: Psalm 23:5 My cup overflows. "my cup runs over, overflows"

Cup of sorrow, cup of pain, cup of blessing (Communion) **Service -** our service to the Lord and others. Ministry flows from our relationship with God.

All Believers Are Gifted To Serve: 1 Peter 4:10-11

#### 7. I Shall Not Want For Eternity: Psalm 23:6

#### Closes with two great assurances:

- 1. Assurance Of Goodness & Mercy:
- **2.** Assurance Of Our Home In Heaven:

#### 1. Assurance Of Goodness & Mercy:

**Surely** — "certainly, without a doubt" could be "yes" **Surely** in Hebrew can be translated as "only." It reads "only goodness and lovingkindness will follow me all the days of my life,." **God is Immutable - Immutability -** The divine attribute of unchangeableness. "I Am," "I Am Who I Am" (Exodus 3:14) Psalm 100:5

**Goodness: goodness –** "prosperous, desirable, beautiful, pleasant" (to supply every need) **Psalm 34:8** 

Lovingkindness: and lovingkindness (mercy) – "love, loyalty, favor, faithfulness" (mercy to forgive every sin) Micah 7:18

**all the days of my life,** our witness of God's goodness and mercy so beneficial, world.

#### 2. Assurance Of Our Home In Heaven:

#### And I will dwell in the house of the LORD forever.

David is not speaking of the temple, no one lived there! This is heaven; home in God's presence!

Psalm 27:4; John 14:2-3

"Heaven Is Not Only The Christians Destination But Also Our Motivation" Philippians 3:20

Heaven Is A Present Place - Luke 23:43; 2 Corinthians 5:8; Revelation 21:4

#### Application:

- **1.** Do We Know The Shepherd Personally? If Not, Will We Trust Him Who Came And Died, Buried, And Arose From The Dead To Forgive Me?
- **2.** Don't Confuse Wants For Need. Our World Is In Great Need For The Shepherd, But Instead, Settles For Wants.
