Paul is addressing the question
"Will the believer's body be raised from the dead?"

Verses 1-11 Resurrection Is Historical Verses 12-19 Resurrection Is Logical

Paul has been saying "if Christ is not risen"

1 Corinthians 15:20 But now Christ has been raised from the dead,

Verses 20-34 Resurrection Brings Results

Paul ties these together as to the <u>Scriptural</u> truth and what it means in the <u>Practical</u>.

Thought Of Our Passage: "The Resurrection Fulfills Scriptural Promises, Without Which There's No Motivation For Salvation, Suffering And Holy Living."

- 2. Verses 29-34 Practical Argument

1. Verses 20-28 Scriptural Argument

1 Corinthians 15:20 But now

Paul has been using the negative in his argument for the resurrection but now he reverses to the positive side to teach the truth.

16 For if the dead are not raised, not even Christ has been raised;

Christ has been raised from the dead,

This is a fact! Jesus Christ is alive.

Paul makes 4 Doctrinal Statements Regarding The Resurrection

1. Verses 20-22 The Dead In Christ Shall Rise the <u>first fruits</u> of those who are asleep.

This is the offering of the Jews (Leviticus 23:10-11)

Elijah raised the widow's son Widows son at Nain Jairus daughter Lazarus 1 King 17:22 Luke 7:15 Mark 5:42 John 11:43 In all these cases, the person was **Resuscitated and had to die again.** Their bodies were the <u>same bodies</u> **John 11:44**

1 Corinthians 15:21 For since by a man (Adam) came death, He brought universal death to the whole world. Romans 5:12

came death, Genesis 2:17

Genesis 5 we read "and He died" "and He died" "and He died" We read that Adam lived 930 years, and he died.

It caught up with Him, and he died.

by a man (Jesus) **also came the resurrection of the dead.** Jesus became a man He died and was resurrected. Jesus became our agent of the physical resurrection.

1 Corinthians 15:22 For as in Adam all die, (Sin nature) There is no escaping this.

so also in Christ, all will be made alive. (Born again)

Only those <u>in Christ</u> that have been born again have eternal life and the promise of the resurrection, that death will not sting.

We are either in Adam or in Christ. There is no in-between.

John 5:28-29 "The Resurrection is as certain as death itself!"

- 1 Corinthians 15:23
- 2. Verses 23-24 Different Stages For Resurrection But each in his own order

In military terms, "Separation of soldiers to march into battle"

#1 Christ the first fruits,

This was the beginning of all resurrections. **Matthew 27:52-53**

- #2 After that those who are Christ's at His coming,
 This would be the rapture of the church.
 OT saints and tribulation saints. Revelation 20:5-6
 - 1 Thessalonians 4:16-18; 1 Corinthians 15:51-52 This will usher in a period of time called "The Tribulation"

Revelation 19-20 the Lord returns at the great battle of Armageddon the greatest blood bath.

1 Corinthians 15:24

#3 then comes the end,

After the millennial reign of Christ.

The resurrection of the unsaved and those that are lost.

(Those that are wicked) Revelation 20:13-15

- 1 Corinthians 15:25 For He must reign until He has put all His enemies under His feet. Romans 8:20-21
- **3.** Verses 25-26 Resurrection Eradicates The Enemy Death: until He has put all His enemies under His feet. After 1000 years, (Millennial reign) Satan will be released. He will make war but will be cast down into the lake of fire for eternity.
- 1 Corinthians 15:26
- 4. Verses 27-28 The Resurrection Results In Total Subjection 1 Corinthians 15:27

No heaven, no subjects of the kingdom. Jesus came to reverse the curse!

1 Corinthians 15:28 Jesus is equal to the Father in divine essence.

Different role or function of Jesus in the trinity. Philippians 2:6

2. Verses 29-34 Practical Argument

If there is no resurrection, then there are **3 practical motivations that would be lost**.

1. Verse 29 Lost Motivation For Evangelism And Salvation Otherwise, what will those do who are baptized for the dead?

If the dead are not raised at all, why then are they baptized for them? Water baptism and the resurrection go together.

By grace, we are saved (Eph 2:8-10)

What does it mean? The Corinthian church was baptizing for the dead. What Paul is saying is why are you doing this if the dead are not raised?

for the dead? Could be translated "in place of"

Baptism symbolizes death and resurrection

2. Verses 30-32 Lost Motivation For Suffering And Service

- **1 Corinthians 15:30** Paul was risking his life for the message that he was living for and preaching.
- **1 Corinthians 15:31 I die daily.** Paul is talking about this process of sanctification whereby we are being stripped of our self.
- 1 Corinthians 15:32 (Isaiah 22:13)

I fought with wild beasts at Ephesus

He was speaking of people.

If the dead are not raised, LET US EAT AND DRINK, FOR TOMORROW WE DIE.

3. Verses 33-34 Lost Motivation To Live a Holy Life

1 Corinthians 15:33

Do not be deceived: "wandering planets in the sky"

"Bad company corrupts good morals."

He is speaking to Christians and is letting them know they are going the wrong way.

1 Corinthians 15:34 Become sober-minded as you ought, Their thinking was worldly. Their minds were on the things of this world.

and stop sinning;

Sinning doctrinally and morally in their lives.

for some have no knowledge of God.

They had lost their love for the lost!

I speak this to your shame.

They were not where they should be with God!
