Postmodernism - No such thing as absolute truth. Rather, truth is personal and subjective – I have my truth and you have your truth.

Why are there Four Gospels? Why didn't God give to us just one account of the life of Jesus Christ? (Only 1 Gospel, 4 Vantage Points) John 21:25

Matthew, Mark, and Luke are called the "Synoptic Gospels" Synoptic is made up of two Greek words meaning, "to see" and "together"

Matthew - was written to the Jews. The theme is "Jesus Christ King of The Jews"

Mark - was written to the Romans. The theme is "The Servant Who Rules"

Luke - was written to the Greeks. The theme is "Jesus The Perfect Man"

John – Written to Gentiles and Christians that we might believe. The Theme is "The Deity of Jesus Christ"

Author: Luke the beloved physician. He was a traveling companion of Paul's. Colossians 4:14 Luke stayed with Paul to the end, his death 2 Timothy 4:11

Luke is the only gospel writer who did not know Jesus physically. Of all the writers of the NT, Luke is the only Gentile. Paul gives a list of Jews and Luke is not in that list. Colossians 4:11

This gospel of Luke and Acts were written by the same person, and written to the same person, Theophilus. Luke 1:3; Acts 1:1

Written To: The Greeks. Luke being a Gentile writes to Gentiles (Greeks) to explain Jesus.

• Luke was a respected physician. **Colossians 4:14** refers to him as "the beloved physician." Luke acts like a doctor - **Luke 4:23, 38; 5:12; 8:43; 13:11; 22:44 Luke the Physician Historian, Theologian.**

• Luke goes out of his way to show the gospel is for every class, nation, race, generation and gender.

Theme Of Luke: Jesus Christ The Perfect Man, The one that the Greeks have longed to be like has come. **Son of Man/Son of God.**

We note that 50% of Luke's content is found exclusively in this gospel. Matthew, 40% and Mark, 10%. Mark was written first then pulled from.

Purpose Of Luke: "Knowing The Exact Truth About Jesus Christ"

When Luke Was Written: The date for the Gospel of Luke: Was probably written 60 AD.

Key Words: Love – 51X, Luke mentions no less than 28 individual, groups, or types of women (15 out of 100 verses). Son of Man – 25X, sinners – 16X, Salvation – 6X

Key Chapter: Luke 15 The three parables of the Lost Sheep, Lost Coin, Lost Son. Jesus came to seek and to save that which is lost.

Luke 1:1-4 Luke's Prologue (Forward, Introduction) Purpose and the source. (One sentence in the Greek, capable of classic Greek)

Thought of Our Passage: "We Can Trust The Historical Gospel Message Because It Is Verifiable, Orderly, And It Is Certain."

Luke 1:1 Inasmuch - which conveys accuracy and can be translated, "Since now"

as many - (Matthew, Mark) and many attempts to record the events of the life of Jesus. "Hearsay" accounts

have undertaken to compile an account - *"narrative"* because it speaks of the historical facts about our faith.

"accomplished among us," - which means it was "performed in the past; and was fulfilled fully, fully persuaded" in plain view of many people. John 1:14

Because Christianity is historical, we can build our faith on facts, not feelings:

2. Verse 2 Gospel Message Is Verifiable

Luke 1:2

Right Channels: handed them down - *"term for oral tradition" The speaking and telling of the events.*

Accurate Sources: by those who from the beginning - The word "beginning" refers to the events surrounding the births of John and Jesus in the first two chapters of Luke's record.

Luke 1:5

The details related to the birth of Jesus are also verifiable in Luke 1:26

Source Of Witnesses: were eyewitnesses - 2 Peter 1:16; 1 John 1:1

Source Of Ministers: servants (Ministers) of the word - *"a subordinate committed to accomplish the commands of a superior" (Persons who knew and lived by the Word they preached)*

We Can Know Christianity Is True Because It Is Verifiable. Eyewitnesses Have Seen And Ministers Continue To Serve To This Day:

3. Verse 3 Gospel Message Is Orderly

Luke 1:3 it seemed fitting for me as well, having investigated everything carefully - This means Luke *"attended carefully and accurately"*

from the beginning, - Starting with John the Baptist. (Historical With Inspirational) This term **beginning** from the first *"from above, from on high"* speaks of inspiration. Luke wrote Scripture! This is the Word of God. **2 Timothy 3:15-17**

All Scripture - "every Scripture, that is, every passage of Scripture, Scripture as a whole is as is the single passage" Literally "every separate passage"

The Origen Of Scripture – Where It Came From: is inspired by God (Only place in the Bible) "divinely breathed in, to breathe, God-breathed" Scripture is the product of God's creative breath. (Writings) Genesis 2:7 Deuteronomy 8:3

Purpose Of Scripture - Reveals What Is Right: and profitable for teaching, *doctrine* (what is right)

profitable - "Every divinely-inspired Scripture is, besides being so inspired and for that reason, also profitable"

Purpose Of Scripture - Reveals What Is Not Right: for reproof, (Negative), The Bible tells us what we should not do. *"to convict of misbehavior or false doctrine, in the sense of rebuke"*

Purpose Of Scripture - Reveals How To Get Right: for correction, (Positive), Confession, Repentance of Sin. *"Restoring something to its original and proper*

condition, an upright state, setting right, fallen now standing upright" To get straighten out, back on our feet!

Purpose Of Scripture - Reveals How To Stay Right: for training in righteousness; Abiding in Jesus, walking in the light, **training –** originally used in training or bringing children up. Then came to mean to train.

to write it out for you in consecutive order, - "an orderly account" This practice was also followed in Acts 11:4

most excellent Theophilus – "loved by God, or dear to God" Acts 23:26 and Acts 26:25; Acts 1:1

The Bible Is Fact, Not Fiction. What's Contained In Luke Is Inspired And Inerrant, It's Not Legend But The Actual Life Of The Lord Jesus Christ In Orderly Manner:

4. Verse 4 Gospel Message Is Certain

Luke 1:4 so that you might know - idea of full knowledge;

the exact truth - *"take no slip, to not totter or fall, the certainty, infallibility of the truth" (Not Tripped Up, Stable)*

about the things - This man was already a believer so Luke wanted to edify this believer, not evangelize.

you have been taught - or instructed. We get our word, "Catechumen" "Someone being taught the basics of Christianity" - words and instructions.
