Thought of Our Passage: "God's Ministers Are Servants And Managers Of God's Truth, Through Which The Lord Himself Will Examine And Judge"

1. Verses 1-2 Minister's Responsibilities

1 Corinthians 4:1 Let a man regard us (Context) 1 Corinthians 3:22-23

Paul has been speaking about building for eternity. 1 Corinthians 3

regard us - Paul changes and begins to focus on what the ministers should be like.

in this manner, - <u>Ministers are likened to 3 Things: Servants, Stewards. Must Be</u> Faithful

1. Ministers Are Servants: as servants of Christ, - Paul says here that ministers are to be seen as servants of Christ!

There is a sense in which all believers are ministers of Christ. Every Christian is a minister -

There are 4 different words for "Servant" that are used in Scripture:

- 1. A Slave: "a bond-slave (-man), servant" one that is bound by love that serves out of love. Chosen, voluntarily Romans 1:1
- 2. Household Servant: "a fellow resident, menial domestic (household) servant" Romans 14:4
- 3. Servant In Service: "to run on errands; an attendant, a waiter (at table or in other menial duties) a deacon or minister, servant" Romans 16:1

4. Oarsman: "an under-oarsman, subordinate, servant" It described the slaves who rowed in the huge Roman galleys. It came to refer to any subordinate—usually an assistant, a helper. **1 Corinthians 4:1**

They are "under-rowers" of Christ.

Luke 17:7-10

2. Ministers Are Stewards: and stewards - "house law" A steward was an administrator, a trustee, an overseer of an estate. He was under the owner and over others within the house. "a house-distributor (manager), or overseer, an employee in that capacity of oversight" Joseph was a chief steward in Potiphar's household (Genesis 39). The church is the "household of faith" (Galatians 6:10)

We would call them "Administrator" or "Supervisor"

Acts 20:28

Being "God's Stewards" Applies To All Christians: 1 Peter 4:10

of the mysteries of God Mentions 4 mysteries of God:

- 1. "mystery of the kingdom of God," Mark 4:11
- 2. "mystery of iniquity" 2 Thessalonians 2:7 of lawlessness.
- 3. "mystery of godliness" 1 Timothy 3:16
- 4. "mystery of the church" Ephesians 3:1-6
- **1 Corinthians 4:2 In this case, moreover**, <u>it is required</u> if they are not trustworthy what good are them?
- 3. Ministers Must Be Faithful: trustworthy "faithful, sure, true"

Romans 14:4

2. Verses 3-5 Minister's Evaluation:

1 Corinthians 4:3

3 Ways To Evaluate:

1. Ministers' Faithfulness Is Not Determined By Others: But to me it is a very small thing that I may be examined by you, "to scrutinize, investigate, interrogate, question, discern, examine, judge, search"

The first pressure Paul mentions is congregational evaluation, and he puts that at the very bottom of the list. "It is a very small thing,"

a very small thing that I may be examined by you Paul did not think it such an important thing, it did not mean much to him. Paul be compared to other ministers.

Stuart Briscoe says there are three kinds of congregational pressure:

- 1. Adoration (which swells the head)
- 2. Manipulation (which ties the hands)
- 3. Antagonism (which breaks the heart)

or by any human court; He did not care if it was some counsel that was put together, some human form of judging and critiquing.

The phrase **any human court (man's judgment)** is literally "man's day" This is in contrast to God's day of judgment yet to come.

- 2. Ministers' Faithfulness Is Not Determined By Self: in fact, I do not even examine myself. Paul did not even care as to what he thought of himself.
 - 2 Corinthians 13:5 "Examine yourselves whether you be in the faith or not,"

(We can be hard on ourselves, or too lenient!)

- 1 Corinthians 4:4 For I am conscious of nothing against myself,
- 1 Corinthians 9:27

yet I am not by this acquitted; We are very limited as to the overall picture. Hebrews 4:12

3. Ministers' Faithfulness Is Determined By God: but the one who examines me is the Lord. He says "Lord is continually examining me" Matthew 18:15-20 God uses other people at times when we sin!

1 Corinthians 4:5 Therefore God is the true Judge; He will be the one that will see the truth.

do not go on passing judgment before the time, - This is not just speaking of sin but motives in people's lives. That was not their task (Romans 14:10, 13)

and then each man's praise will come to him from God. God will reward each one of us accordingly to what we really deserve.

3. Verses 6-7 Minister's Freedom

1 Corinthians 4:6 Now these things, brethren, Speaking about responsibility and the evaluation of the minister.

so that in us you may learn not to exceed what is written, - Sometimes our standards have gone beyond what the Bible says!

No Believer Is Better Than Another: so that no one of you will become arrogant in behalf of one against the other.

What freedom it is to not be controlled by pride:

1 Corinthians 4:7 For who regards you as superior? The answer to this has to be referring to man! What does it matter what man says?

Every Believer Is Indebted To God: What do you have that you did not receive?

And if you did receive it, why do you boast as if you had not received it?
