# "Money Matters" 1 Timothy 6:17-19 Sunday, November 8, 2020

**Stewardship** – "Is one that manages, or has oversight over the affairs of another; he does not own that which he has been entrusted with but manages it as if it is his own"

There are at least **2,350 passages** in the Bible dealing with money and material possessions. That's more than on any other subject.

The Bible teaches that Money is "The Great Revealer of The Soul."

Theme 1 Timothy – "Entrusted With The Truth" Paul is giving instructions to Timothy regarding Church Order and Conduct.

- 1 Timothy 5-6 The Church and Its Ministry:
- **1 Timothy 6:6-10** Paul spoke to the poor about the danger of wanting to get rich.
- 1 Timothy 6:11-16 Paul's Final Charge To Timothy: "The Man of God"
- **1 Timothy 6:17-19 Paul returns to the subject of Money:** Paul speaks to the Rich regarding the <u>dangers</u> and <u>responsibilities</u> of riches. Paul balances between the poor and the rich.

**Thought Of Our Passage:** "The Bible Teaches That Wealth Imposes Both Dangers And Responsibilities On Its Possessors."

#### 1. Verse 17 Dangers Of The Rich

**1 Timothy 6:17** Note The Context – Paul has described "The Man of God" and concluded with "The God of The Man" **1 Timothy 6:15-16** 

**Instruct** the command denotes a constant repetition of the charge. "Keep on instructing them" (Rich easily deceived) Comes from the King of Kings!

**those who are rich in this present world** Paul speaks to those that have much of what the world has to offer, <u>some are thinking only of this present world!</u>

**The City of Ephesus -** was an extremely wealthy city. **Ephesus -** name meant: "Desirable."

who are rich – "to have more than food and clothing, and shelter, to have discretionary dollars." Most Western Christians today fall into this category.
1 Timothy 6:8

Wealth and Poverty are relative terms. Neither can be neatly defined.

rich in this present world literally "to the rich in the now age give a charge...." These are rich, in contrast to those who desire to become rich 1 Timothy 6:9

Some become wealthy after their conversion. Abraham (Genesis 13:2), David, Solomon, other righteous Kings of Judah, and Joseph of Arimathea, (Matthew 27:57)

**present world** stresses the present situation in contrast to the eternal.

### **2 Dangers Confronting The Rich:**

**1. The Danger Of Pride - not to be conceited -** two Greek words, "to think" and "exalted thoughts" "to be lofty in mind, arrogant, to be high-minded."

**Proverbs 18:23; Proverbs 28:11** 

Pride can become the curse of the rich. (Often Wealth & Conceit Go Together)

Opposite Of Pride Is Humility: Philippians 2:3 Moses cautioned, Deuteronomy 8:18

2. Danger Of False Security – or to fix their hope The verb means: "to set one's hope upon something or someone and to leave it there" The proud & wealthy are **Short-Sighted!** And have **False Hope!** 

## hope on the uncertainty of riches,

Literally, "putting hope on uncertainty, not even upon the riches themselves"

Proverbs 23:4-5 (NLT) Proverbs 11:28

**Luke 12:16-21** Rich man counting his money suddenly dies. **Luke 16:22-23** Rich man that woke up in hell,

Life's Circumstances Are Ever-Changing: James 4:13-14

We Don't Know When We Will Die: James 4:14-16

The Only Thing Certain About Material Riches Is That They Are Uncertain: 1 John 2:17

Riches Don't & Can't Satisfy: Ecclesiastes 5:10

Danger - "Today's gains are tomorrow's losses."

#### 2. Verses 17-19 Responsibilities Of The Rich

- 1 Timothy 6:17 but Paul changes from negative to positive pursuits: 7 Actions that the rich should take to ensure genuine security.
- 1. Verse 17 The Rich Should Trust in God: but in God,

Hope Should Be In God – but on God, Not on gold. (NLT)
Psalm 55:16

(KJV) Psalm 56:11 In God have I put my trust:

It Is Foolish To Trust In Things Because God Alone Is The True Giver! - God who richly supplies us with all things to enjoy.

James 1:17; Psalm 50:10-12; Ecclesiastes 5:18-20

2. Verse 18 The Rich Should Do Good: 1 Timothy 6:18 Instruct them to do good,

The phrase literally reads, "to work that which is good." A rich person should put their money to work.

Wealth must be seen as a divine stewardship and an opportunity to advance the kingdom of God. **Ephesians 2:10** 

Enjoyment is found in giving, sharing, and blessing others! all things to enjoy. Acts 20:35

3. Verse 18 The Rich Should Be Rich in Good Works: 1 Timothy 6:18 to be rich in good works,

The Church at Smyrna - Revelation 2:9 The Church of Laodicea - Revelation 3:17

The Macedonians "the riches of their liberality" 2 Corinthians 8:1-2

A rich man is both foolish and poor when he lays up "treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God." Luke 12:21

**4. Verse 18 The Rich Should Be Generous: 1 Timothy 6:18 to be generous -** Literally reads, "to be persons who impart their possessions in a pleasing fashion."

Giving And Generosity Go Together - Romans 12:8

We Should Work To Give - Ephesians 4:28

Giving Well, Is Giving Willingly, Bountifully, And Purposefully – 2 Corinthians 9:6-7

I believe that the NT teaches "Grace Giving."
The OT (Israel) was to **Tithe** – 10% along with other offerings they gave as much as 30% - 35% to God. **1 Corinthians 16:2; Malachi 3:10** 

God is concerned about Attitudes (The Heart) and Actions!

5. Verse 18 The Rich Should Be Ready To Share: 1 Timothy 6:18 and ready to share,

"Inclined to impart, free in giving" This word is related to the word for "fellowship" The emphasis is on financial sharing or communication.

**Titus 3:14** 

Love Requires That We Give Both Resources And Ourselves: The Poor Churches of Macedonia, Paul says, 2 Corinthians 8:4-5

6. Verse 19 The Rich Should Store Treasures In Heaven: storing up for themselves - speaks of "the accumulation of treasure" Trusting in God, doing good, rich in good works, generous and ready to share! (NLT) Proverbs 11:24-25; Luke 6:38

of a good foundation for the future, - Through this financial generosity, a rich believer can lay a future reward for holy service, Luke 18:22

7. Verse 19 The Rich Who Live For Eternity Can Enjoy Eternal Life: 1 Timothy 6:19 so that they may take hold of that which is life indeed.

**life indeed –** literally, "Life that is truly life."

## **Application:**

- **1.** The Rich Battle With Pride, And False Security But Instead Should Trust God And Invest In That Which Is Eternal.
- 2. We Can't Take It With Us When We Die, But We Can Send It Ahead.
- **3.** The Paradox Of Benevolence Is That The More One Gives Away The More One Deposits In Heaven.
