"A Father's Faith & Obedience" Genesis 22:1-14 Father's Day, June 16, 2019

Genesis 22:1-3, 9-14

"The Father of Faith;" Abraham - "The father of a multitude."

At the age of 75, Abraham enrolled in the "School of Faith."

The Key Chapters of Abraham's life are the following:

- 1. Genesis 12 Abraham Received His Call From God.
- 2. Genesis 15 Abraham's Conversion.
- **3. Genesis 22 –** Abraham's Faith Is Tested.

Thought Of Our Passage: "One's Faith Must Always Be Tested, But Through God's Promises Will Come God's Provision."

- 1. Verses 1-2 Faith Will Be Tested
- 2. Verses 3-5 Cling To God's Promises
- 3. Verses 6-14 Depend On God Who Provides

1. Verses 1-2 - Faith Will Be Tested:

Genesis 22:1 – "Now it came about after these things," – What things? Genesis 21 – Isaac was born, which was a fulfillment of a 25-year promise. Ishmael and Hagar were banished from the home.

Genesis 21:34 – "And Abraham sojourned in the land of the Philistines for many days." The "many days" is about 15-30 years of time that has elapsed between Genesis 21:35 and Genesis 22:1.

Abraham - "The Father of a Multitude." He is also an example of priorities.

"God tested Abraham," – the word "tested" – "to try, to prove, to put to the proof/test."

God – "tests" to draw <u>upward</u>, to "prove," to reveal to us where we are, not Him. God wants to bring our worth out! To cause us to trust Him.

Satan – "tempts" to draw <u>downward</u>, to draw us away from God; to bring out our worst! To make us work independently from God (Respond sinfully).

"and said to him, 'Abraham!'" – No mistake, God is calling Abraham by name.

"And he said, 'Here I am.'" – It is one thing to hear God call us. It is quite another to obey God's call to us!

Genesis 22:2 – "And He said, 'Take now your son, your <u>only son</u>,'" – God goes for the heart; The very thing that was dear to Him, John 3:16.

"whom you love," - the word "love" - means "grown to love."

"son" - Isaac - "he laughs or laughing one."

"and go to the land of Moriah;" – Moriah – "Chosen by God." It was chosen for the future temple; chosen for the <u>place of sacrifices</u>, chosen as <u>Calvary!</u>

"and offer him there as a burnt offering (Total Dedication) on one of the mountains of which I will tell you."

2. Verses 3-5 - Cling To God's Promises:

Genesis 22:3

Father's Obedience Is Modeled 3 Ways:

1. Prompt Obedience: "So Abraham rose early in the morning and saddled his donkey," – This is ready obedience.

"Delayed Obedience Is Disobedience."

Psalm 119:60

Abraham knew that God would be faithful to His promise, so he held on to the promise, Genesis 21:12.

Abraham Didn't Question God's Command!

Verses 2-11 – There is no mention that God spoke to Abraham during the 3 days that it took to get the destination.

Genesis 22:4 – "On the third day" – This is not here by accident. It was on the third day that Jesus rose from the dead. Nothing short of a resurrection was needed.

2. Sustained Obedience: "On the third day" – Abraham was living in Beersheba. Travel to Mount Moriah (Jerusalem) was about 50 miles away.

"third day" – Always signifies the cross, the grave and the resurrection. (Impossible)

"saw the place from a distance." – Have you seen the place from a distance? John 8:56

Genesis 22:5

3. True Worship Is Obedience: "I and the lad will go over there; and we will worship and return to you."

An Obedient Faith must always go alone; God wants <u>our</u> hearts.

Worship – means "to bow down;" <u>First time used in Scripture</u>. It is used in connection with Abraham sacrificing His only son, beloved son; In sacrifice.

Sacrifice, Love and Obedience are connected with Worship.

"and return to you." - Hebrews 11:17-19.

3. Verses 6-14 - Depend On God Who Provides:

Genesis 22:6 – "Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and <u>laid it on Isaac his son</u>," – Notice that Isaac, the sacrifice, was carrying his own cross.

This is exactly what Jesus Christ did, He bore His own cross, John 19:17.

Jesus, God's Son, Took It Willingly: John 10:17-18.

Genesis 22:7 – "where is the lamb for the burnt offering?" – This shows that Abraham had taught Isaac well about the need of a sacrifice.

All the OT sacrifices, the Passover lamb was all just a picture of Jesus Christ!

Genesis 22:8 – "God will provide for Himself the lamb for the burnt offering, my son." – As Abraham climbed Mount Moriah with his son, Abraham was confident that God would meet every need.

Genesis 22:14

Genesis 18:14; Philippians 4:13

"So the two of them walked on together." – <u>Mutual trust in each other</u>, based on their trust in God.

Genesis 22:9 – "bound his son Isaac and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood." – Isaac was 15-30 years of age, Abraham 115-130.

Genesis 22:10

Take away faith, and Abraham is nothing short of a murderer. He was putting his faith in God, James 2:21-22.

Genesis 22:11-13

"offered him (Ram) up for a burnt offering in the place of his son." – This is called, "Substitutionary Atonement;" the price of redemption was paid by another. This was a ram, next time, The Lamb Of God!

God Has Provided The Sacrifice - John 1:29.

Blessing Follows Obedience: "ram caught in the thicket by his horns;"

God Met Abraham's Need At The Right Moment.

Genesis 22:14 – "Jehovah Jireh," – "The LORD Will Provide." – The word "Provision" – Pro – to provide; vision – to see. "The Lord will see to it" or "The Lord will be seen."

God Provided For Abraham Because He Was In The Right Place And In God's Will. – "In the mount of the LORD it will be provided."

Application:

- 1. Our Faith Is Not Really Tested Until God Asks Us To Bear What Seems Unbearable, Do What Seems Unreasonable, And Expect What Seems Impossible.
- 2. We Must Cling To God's Promises. Abraham's Trust Was Shown Through Prompt Obedience, A Sustained Obedience, And True Worship, Which Is Obedience.
- 3. Depend On God Who Provides. Charles Spurgeon Said, "The Promises Of God Never Shine Brighter Than In The Furnace Of Affliction."
