## 1. Verses 23-27 - A Challenge of Jesus:

The Chief Priests – (Spiritual Hierarchy) claimed their authority from Moses:

The Elders – (Representatives of the Congregation)

Luke 20:1 The Scribes – (Pseudo-experts of the written and oral traditions)

Who gave You this authority?" Literally - "What kind of authority is it, Divine or human?"

A Counter Question: And Jesus answered and said to them, "I will ask you one thing too"

- 1. Because John was God's witness that He sent to His people.
- 2. John was the light that was to point to Jesus Christ.

## 2. Verses 28-32 - Two Very Different Sons:

"But what do you think?" Jesus launches into 3 Parables in order to get them to think independently.

- 1. The Two Sons Matt 21:28-32
- 2. The Vineyard Parable Matt 21:33-44
- 3. The Marriage Feast Matt 22:1-14

A man - this man represents God.

had two sons, the first son - represents the self-righteous religious leaders

Second son – represents the sinner that has been in rebellion to God's commands. Matt 21:31

Vineyard – The nation of Israel.

regretted - "to care afterwards, regret". He repented and went. There was a change in heart.
