- 1. Verses 57-58 The High Priest Before Jesus:

Matt 26:56

Jesus actually endured six different trials. Three of them were Ecclesiastical (Religious), and three were Civil.

1. Examination by Annas. John 18:12-24

John 18:13

Annas - served as high priest from A.D. 6 to A.D. 15

John 18:23

- 2. Caiaphas Holds Court. Matt 26:57
- 3. The Sanhedrin Sentences the Savior to Death. Matthew 27:1
- 4. Jesus is Presented to Pilate. This is recorded by all four gospels (Matthew 27:11-31; Mark 15:1-15; Luke 23:1-5; John 18:28-40).
- 5. Jesus has a Hearing with Herod. This is only recorded in Luke 23:6-12
- 6. Jesus is Sentenced to Death by Pilate. Matthew 27:26-31

Matt 26:57

Both Annas and Caiaphas were Sadducees - which meant they did not believe in the <u>resurrection</u>, the <u>spirit world</u>, or the <u>authority</u> of any of the Old Testament except the <u>five Books of Moses</u>.

Caiaphas, who was supposed to be the spiritual leader of Israel.

2. Verses 59-66 - The False Witnesses Of Jesus:

There were many violations of the law that were committed.

- 1. The hearing was at the High Priest's resident. (Must be held in the hall of the temple.)
- 2. The hearing was to be held during the day. (This was about 3:00 A.M.)
- 3. The hearing was not to be held on holiday or festival. (This was during Passover.)
- 4. The purpose of the hearing was not to condemn, but to see if there were legitimate charges. (They wanted to condemn and bring death.)
- 5. If death was decided, they would wait one day. (They tried and executed the same day.)

Matt 26:66

They, the Scribes, were the masters of the OT; they should begin to investigate the charges in light of Scripture.

They, the Elders, were in charge of the defense of anyone in danger of being put to death.

- 1. The Messiah was to have been born in Bethlehem, and Jesus was: (Micah 5:2; Luke 2:1-7)
- 2. The Messiah was to be born, and Jesus was born of Mary, who was a virgin at the time: (Isa. 7:14; Matt. 1:24, 25; Luke 1:26-30)
- 3. The Messiah was to be of David's line, and Jesus was descended from King David: (2 Sam. 7:12, 16: Isa. 11:1-2; Matt 1:1-16; Luke 3:23-37)
- 4. The Messiah was to be preceded by a figure like Elijah, and John the Baptist filled that role: (Mal. 3:1; 4:5; Matt. 17:12-13; John 1:19-23)

- 5. The Messiah was to do many great works, and Jesus had performed the works that had been prophesied: (Isa. 61:1-2; Matt. 11:1-6; Luke 4:16-21)
- 6. The Messiah was to make a public entry into Jerusalem riding on a donkey, and Jesus had done this just a few days before: (Zech. 9:9; Matt. 21:1-11)
- 7. The Messiah was to be betrayed by a close friend, and Jesus was so betrayed: (Psalm 41:9; Matt. 26:14-15; 27:3-8)
- 8. The Messiah was to be despised and rejected by His people and to be familiar with suffering, and Jesus was: (Isa. 53:2-3)

The Son of God; The Old Testament contains the fact that God would take on flesh.

- 1. The OT describes precisely the kind of unique Son of God Jesus claimed to be: (Psalm 2:7; Isa. 9:6)
- 2. The OT speaks of God becoming flesh: (Isa. 7:14)
- 3. The OT contains passages in which Jehovah is said to have appeared among men: (Gen. 16:13; 18:13,17, 26; Dan. 3:25)
