Series "Jesus: God And Savior" "Blind Investigators" John 9:13-34 Part-34

"God's Truth Is Readily Available, But The Heart Of Man Determines Whether To Accept Or Reject."

The Pattern Of A <u>Miracle/Sign</u> – Jesus sees human need and meets it; Points to His Divine Nature.

Leads To A <u>Conflict</u> – Which Leads To A <u>Sermon</u>. The sermon is an exposition of what the miracle meant. He would use the sign to give a sermon.

Jesus is the light of the world who offers <u>sight to the blind</u>. But some choose to reject the light and remain <u>blind</u>.

Thought Of Our Passage: The Religious Leaders Teach Us That Spiritual Blindness Is A More Serious Condition Than Physical Blindness.

<u>1. Verses 13-17 – The Man's Faithful Witness</u> <u>2. Verses 18-23 – The Parents' Compromise</u> <u>3. Verses 24-34 – The Man's Spiritual Sight</u>

<u>1. Verses 13-17 – The Man's Faithful Witness</u>:

John 9:13 – "They brought to the Pharisees the man who was formerly blind."

"They" – these were the people (Verses 8-12) that knew him as a beggar.

"brought to the Pharisees the man" – He was healed on a Sabbath, a violation to the leaders. John 9:14

"who was formerly blind." – This is John's 6th Sign, "The Master of Misfortune."

John 9:14

John 5:18

7X in the Gospels, Jesus heals on the Sabbath. "Seven" – complete, perfection.

John 9:15

"the Pharisees also were asking him again" – "kept on asking him."

The Real Test Of The Man's Courage: "how he received his sight." John 9:16

Jeremiah 17:22

Talmudic Rabbis developed 24 chapters, a list of 39 categories of work that were prohibited on the Sabbath.

There were approximately 1,521 things that were not permissible on the Sabbath.

Violation – Jesus spat on the ground and made mud.

Violation – Rabbis forbid healing on the Sabbath day.

Violation – Jesus used saliva for healing.

Luke 6:5 – "The Son Of Man is Lord of the Sabbath."

Some Thought For Themselves: "How can a man who is a sinner perform such signs?"

"And there was a division among them." – There always is a division over Jesus.

John 9:17

Jesus Is A Prophet: "And he said, 'He is a prophet." – "one who speaks for another." The man continues to grow spiritually.

He regards Jesus as a man (verse 11), but now he sees Him as God's man, a gifted man with insight and understanding, a great man.

2. Verses 18-23 – The Parents' Compromise:

John 9:18

"The Jews then did not believe it of him, that he had been blind and had received sight," – They have hardened hearts as to the truth. Deuteronomy 32:20

John 9:19-21

"Ask him; he is of age, he will speak for himself." – This is called "The way of the chicken" or "Passing of the buck!"

John 9:22

"he was to be put out of the synagogue." – Excommunicate – no temple, no synagogue, no business, no job or customers, social rejection; Talmud lists 24 offenses.

John 9:23

Romans 10:9

3. Verses 24-34 - The Man's Spiritual Sight:

John 9:24

"<u>So a second time</u> they called the man who had been blind," – Looking and hoping to find discrepancies in his interviews.

"said to him, 'Give glory to God;" – That is an official oath they are putting him under. Joshua 7:19 – "I swear to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth, so help me God."

"we know that this man is a sinner." – The word "know": "claim to absolute knowledge." No matter what you say, we know that this man is a sinner!

John 9:25 – "Whether He is a sinner, I do not know;"

"one thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see." – This is all we have to know!

What we need to know is that we were lost and now we are found.

John 9:26-27

"You do not want to become His disciples <u>too</u>, do you?" – He now counted himself a disciple of Jesus!

John 9:28 – "They reviled him," – "they abused him; they chewed him out."

"and said, 'You are His disciple, but we are disciples of Moses." – The line was drawn. (Moses is greater than Jesus)

John 9:29

"we do not know where He is from." – These are the words of unbelief (We don't want to know where He is from!); Lie – John 7:27.

Verses 30-33 – Theology Of A Beggar: John 9:30.

John 9:31

"We know that God does not hear sinners;" – Psalm 66:18.

Proverbs 15:29

"but if anyone is God-fearing, and does His will, He hears him." – Acts 10.

John 9:32 – Isaiah 35:5 foretells the Messiah would do so!

John 9:33

Jesus Is From God: "from God" – He is the one sent from God. The man's insight has grown tremendously. One whom God has sent – The Messiah.

The Beggar's Theology of Jesus: 1) Only God can heal congenital blindness. 2) Jesus healed congenital blindness. 3) Jesus must be from God.

John 9:34

"They answered him, 'You were born entirely in sins," – "you were steeped in sin at birth." Your sickness is because of your sin!

"And they put him out." – The false shepherds put the man out, but the true shepherd takes him in.

Application: <u>4 Lessons we learn from this man</u>:

- 1. We, Like This Man, Should Also Be Straightforward In Telling Others What Jesus Has Done For Us. His Testimony Was Factual And Personal.
- 2. We, Like This Man, Should Also Refuse To Argue.
- 3. We, Like This Man, Should Also Expect Conflict.
- 4. We, Like This Man, Should Remember That God Will Not Abandon Us: John 9:35-38.
