## "The Pentateuch" Deuteronomy 1 Wednesday April 20, 2011

**Genesis** – A Man's sin and condemnation.

**Exodus –** Man's need of redemption.

**Leviticus** – Man's need of separation in order to have communion with God.

**Numbers** – Man's Need to Trust God, and the Consequences of Not Trusting God.

**Deuteronomy** – Man's Need to Obey God. The Encouragement To Obey is God's Goodness, God's Law as a Guide, God's Faithfulness, and Moses' Example.

The Greek name is the Pentateuch – which means "5 books"

Deuteronomy – is quoted over 80 times in the NT Books.

Deuteronomy 31:9-13

Deuteronomy – The name comes from the opening phrase in the first verse. Deut. 1:1 – "These are <u>the words</u>"; "the words" which Moses spoke to all Israel

"Deuteronomy" in Greek means "Repetition of the Law" or literally "Second Law"

**The Author –** Over 40X it says the Moses wrote it. Deut. 31:24-26

**When Written** – The last month of Moses life. Deut 1:3 and 34:8; Joshua 1:2 Written after 40 years in the wilderness (1405 BC)

Where it was Written – The Plains of Moab. Where Numbers leaves off. Deut 29:1

Deut. 1:1

**Purpose** – Farewell Address by Moses at 120 years old. Moses reviews the Law to a new generation that wants to receive the Land.
