Deut 1-5 — Moses reviewed the past and helped the new generation appreciate all that God had done for them.

Deut 6-11 — Moses told the people how they should respond to the goodness of God and why they should obey Jehovah.

Deuteronomy 12-26 — Moses now builds on this foundation and applied the law to Israel's new situation in the Promised Land.

Death is Normal, it is not Natural.
