The word "treacherously" or "wrong", "violence" could be interpreted as "bitterness" – and often that is the result of divorce.

Deuteronomy 24:1 indecency - (lit.) "nakedness, impurity"

Death penalty was for adultery – Lev 20:10; Deut 22:13-30

Matt 19:3-9

There were 2 Schools of Thought During Jesus' Day:

1. Rabbi Hillel – (Liberal)

Too much salt in soup, talk back, insulting comments were all grounds for divorce. Get tired of your wife – Don't commit adultery – just divorce her.

Rabbi Akiba – "a man could divorce his wife if he found a woman who was more beautiful."

2. Rabbi Shammai – (Conservative) Some grave sin – sexual sin, possibly shameful exposure.

Moses instituted regulations designed to do 3 things:

- 1. Protect the sanctity of marriage from something indecent or defiling of the relationship.
- 2. Protect the woman from a husband who might simply send her away without a cause. (Paperwork defining the offense)
- 3. To Document the wife's status as a legitimately divorced woman, so that she would not be thought of as a harlot or a runaway adulteress.

Matt 19:7-8

Hardness of heart – "doing your own thing, doing it your own way"

Moses <u>permitted you</u> to divorce your wives; Moses did not Command Divorce, but Permitted; a Concession to human weakness. Divorce cheapens the covenant; it makes the vows taken meaningless; it destroys the sense of commitment.
