Deuteronomy 27 The Curses:

Deut 27:1-13 – Memory Stones, The Altar and the Mountains: Deuteronomy 27:1

Once in the land of Canaan, the children of Israel were to do <u>3 Additional</u> <u>Things</u>:

1. Deut 27:2-4 – Israel Was To Set Up Memorial Stones: Deuteronomy 27:2-3

God wrote His Word plainly so we could understand it. "The plain things are the main things and the main things are the plain things"

Deuteronomy 27:4

2. Deut 27:5-10 – Israel Was To Build An Altar: Deuteronomy 27:5-6

The God of the altar is more important than the altar of God.

Ephesians 2:8-9

Romans 3:20

Burnt offerings – spoke about complete dedication unto the Lord – the entire animal was burnt.

Deuteronomy 27:7 Peace offerings – represented a joyful fellowship with God – shared meal.

The Altar Was Also A Place Of Atonement.

3. Deut 27:11-13 – Israel Was To Be Divided Between Two Mountains:

Mt Ebal and Mt Gerizim were near Shechem.

Shechem - Gen 12:6

Gen 33:18-20

Gerizim – (green & lush) represented the blessings for obedience.

Ebal – (dry and barren) represented the curses for disobedience

The people kept this commitment in Joshua 8:33-35





- 2. The Altar Was The Place To Worship God Israel Was Not To Use A Tool To Build That Altar, Because None of Our Works Have Any Place On That Altar.
- The Altar Was Also A Place Of Atonement God Knew That Israel Would Break The Law (We Fall Short Of The Glory Of God); The Altar Was To Remind Israel (Us) That When We Fail, God Provided A Place And Procedure (Blood) Of Atonement For Us (Jesus).
