Romans 1-5 – Justification – Declared Righteous; Romans 6-8 – Sanctification

Romans 6 - Victory Over Sin: Verses 1-14 - United To Christ; Verses 15-23 - Slavery of Righteousness: Sanctification - God takes a justified man and makes him holy.

Thought Of Our Passage: "When Jesus Died, The Believer Also Died, And When Jesus Was Raised, The Believer Was Also Raised."

- 1. Verses 1-5 Reality Of Our Death With Christ
- 2. Verses 6-7 Reason For Our Death With Christ
- 3. Verses 8-11 Results Of Our Death With Christ

1. Verses 1-5 - Reality Of Our Death With Christ:

Romans 6:1 – "What shall we say then?" – Context: Paul just taught about the origin of sin; Original Sin; Sin entered into the world by the 1^{st} Adam.

Jesus Christ, the 2nd Adam, by one act of righteousness, took the punishment for every sin and offers forgiveness to all, Romans 5:21.

"Are we to continue in sin so that grace might increase?" – "Shall we habitually continue in sin in order that grace may abound? Or shall we habitually sin because grace does abound?" Romans 5:20

Romans 3:8

Antinomianism – "anti – against, nomian – the law;" under the gospel of grace, the moral law is of no use or obligation, because faith alone is necessary to salvation," Jude 1:4.

"Does grace undermine ethical responsibility and promote reckless sinning?"

Romans 6:2 – "May it never be!" – "forbid the thought, inconceivable, what a ghastly thought." Sanctification follows Justification!

"How shall we who died to sin" – "Death," "Died" – 14X in our passage, 1 John 3:9.

Jesus not only saved us from the <u>penalty of sin</u>, but the <u>power of sin</u>; we died to sin – it's power – dominion over us!

Truth – We Died To Sin: How Can We Live In What We Have Died To? – "How shall we who died to sin <u>still live in it</u>?" – "We died to sin in the past. How then shall we live in it in the future?"

1 Corinthians 10:13

Verses 3-5 – Baptism Illustrates The Believers Death: Romans 6:3 – "Or do you not know" – "Are you ignorant of the meaning of your own baptism? Have you forgotten what your baptism symbolized?"

"know," – "Knowing" – 3X; based on facts. Paul shares 3 important words: "Know, Knowing" – Verses 3,6,9; "Reckon" – Verse 11; "Yield" – Verse 13.

"baptized" – "to dip or dye;" it comes to be known as identification, "to be joined to, to be in union with something else, identify with something else," 1 Corinthians 10:2; Matthew 28:19.

Truth – The Way We Died To Sin Was Our Baptism That Unites Us To Christ In His Death: "have been baptized into His death?"

Know - You have died to sin... you are identified with Christ.

Romans 6:4 – "Therefore" – Baptism is our identification with Christ's death.

"so that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father," – We died with Him, we were buried with Him, we were also raised with Him.

Truth – Having Shared In Christ's Death, God Wants Us Also To Share In His Resurrection Life: "we too might walk in newness of life" – 1. <u>Power Of Sin broken</u>; 2. <u>Divine Nature Imparted</u>.

Romans 6:5 – "united" – this word means "grown together." It speaks of a branch bound to another; they are grafted together.

1 Corinthians 12:13; Galatians 3:27

2. Verses 6-7 - Reason For Our Death With Christ:

Romans 6:6 – "knowing this," – Should know; "that our old self" – Old Man; "something completely warn out, useless;" The BC person of the past before salvation: Ephesians 4:22; Colossians 3:9

"was crucified with Him" – We can't crucify ourselves, it must be done by another. Notice it is <u>past tense</u>; means it already took place, already accomplished.

Galatians 2:20; Galatians 5:24; Galatians 6:14

"body of sin" – is not sinful in itself, it's neutral. – "our body of sin" – It is sin that enters through our will – we choose to sin – Sin uses the members of our body.

"might be done away" – destroyed – "powerless, inoperative – void, helpless."

Truth – Our Former Self Was Crucified With Christ In Order That We Might Be Freed From Sin's Slavery: "so that we would no longer be slaves to sin;"

Romans 6:7; 1 John 1:10

"freed from sin" – 3X – 7,18,22; "NOT free to sin, but free from sin."

Colossians 3:1

3. Verses 8-11 - Results Of Our Death With Christ:

Romans 6:8 - Romans 8:10-11

Romans 6:9

Truth – Both The Death And Resurrection Of Jesus Were Decisive Events; He Died To Sin Once For All, But He Lives Continuously Unto God: "knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, is never to die again;"

"is never to die again;" – That is security, That Jesus has died once, Revelation 1:18.

Acts 2:24

Romans 6:10 – "For the death that He died, He died to sin," – This is the purpose of the cross. "Jesus' Substitutionary Death was for us; Jesus Took Our Place."

"once for all" – This idea of perpetual sacrifice of Christ on the cross is heretical.

Hebrews 7:27; Hebrews 10:10; John 19:30 - "It is finished!"

"but the life that He lives, He lives to God." – Jesus' whole life was submission.

Romans 6:11 – "Even so" – We died with Jesus, We now live through Jesus. "consider" – an accounting term; "record, to calculate, to impute to one's account, record in the ledger of life." – "yourselves to be dead to sin,"

Truth – We Must Realize That We Are Now What Christ Is; Namely, Dead To Sin But Alive To God – "consider yourselves to be dead to sin,"

"but alive to God in Christ Jesus." – We have the life of Jesus, Romans 8:11.

Application:

- 1. The Secret Of Holy Living Is Knowing We Died With Christ. It Is Knowing It Second By Second, Minute By Minute, Hour By Hour, Day By Day. It's A Reality That We Died, We Were Buried, And We Were Raised.
- 2. We Don't Conquer Sin, Sin Has Already Been Conquered Through Christ. When We Were Justified, We Received God's Resurrection Power To Live.
- 3. To Say That I Must Sin, Is To Deny The Foundations Of Christianity. To Say That I Cannot Sin Is To Deceive Myself. To Say That I Need Not Sin Is To State A Divine Privilege.
- 4. Donald Grey Barnhouse Said, "Holiness Starts Where Justification Finishes, And If Holiness Does Not Start, We Have The Right to Suspect That Justification Never Started Either."
