Exodus 1-18 Redemption: The Lord Delivers His People

Exodus 3-4 Moses' encounter with God and Moses' Calling

Plague – means literally "a stroke, or a blow". It was through these divine blows that God was bringing the Egyptians to their knees by revealing His power.

Each one to take a lamb for themselves, this is the central object of the Passover is the lamb.

Identification of the lamb: "Your lamb"

This lamb was the substitute for the first born of Israel.

Separateness of the Lamb: you may take it from the sheep or from the goats.

Leaven - The term leaven - Yeast (98X; always a bad sense) Ex. 12:14-20; This is used in scripture as a picture of evil or of corruption; very small, secretly without noise, takes over and permeates the entire lump of dough.

Lamb – speaks of "Redemption"

Bread – speaks of "spiritual sustenance", to be pure, that represents Christ.
