1. Verses 34-37 – The Intro:

Acts 10-11 is the account of the Gospel transitioning from a Jewish Church to include all humanity.

"I most certainly understand now" – the word means "to seize or grasp something; I get it!"

"Partiality" – Literally "A face taker"

"preaching peace through Jesus Christ" – Kerygma is the Greek word used in the New Testament for Preaching; "to cry or proclaim as a herald, make a proclamation, announcement, or preaching."

Not every message has all six but the six are repeated in the ongoing teaching of the Apostolic Church. This is the foundation of Christian teaching.

Verse 38 – Jesus Life And Works: "how God anointed Him with the Holy Spirit"; The idea of "dedication to a sacred purpose."

"hanging Him on a cross." – The word cross is literally "Wood", so we say cross which is made of wood; tree which is wood – Deut 21:22-23; Gal 3:13

Verse 42 – Jesus Returns As Judge: Acts 10:42

“believes” – means to “commit unto, be committed to one's trust, to have faith in”; Then and only then does one receive forgiveness of sins.”

“keys” – symbolizes “authority; the authority to open and close doors”

Peter was given the privilege first of opening “the door of salvation through faith”; to the Jews at Pentecost (Acts 2), to the Samaritans (Acts 8:14), and now to the Gentiles Acts (10:44).

Application:

The Historical Christian Conversion Involves The Following:

- Confession Of Faith – Acts 10:43: Faith in a Crucified Savior, risen from the dead, who died for our sins that He might bring us to God. Forsaking our old sinful life of the past, to follow Jesus because He is Lord and Master.
- Christian Experience – Because we are now born again and have a new nature, we now long to be conformed to the image of God, we long to be with others with the same nature and desire. This must be personal. It can't be our parents, spouse or friend but must be our own.
- Believer's Identification Through Baptism – This was universal in the NT Church. It does not save us but it does testify that we are saved and following Jesus.
