Application:

- 1. The work of God is begun, sustained, and encouraged by the Word of God.
- 2. God's servants must work together to build God's temple. Haggai and Zechariah, an older man and a younger man, both ministered the Word to the Jewish remnant, and God blessed their mutual efforts.
