Philip – was one of the first lay-helpers (7 Chosen) of the early church. (Acts 6:5), called "the evangelist" Acts 21:8

Philip Was Sensitive To The Voice of God: "angel of the Lord spoke to Philip saying",

Acts 1:11; Acts 5:19; Heb 1:14

What is the context of God's command to Philip?

Acts 8-12 Witness to Judea and Samaria - and in all Judea and Samaria,

Gaza – This was 80 miles southwest from the city of Samaria. This was originally a fortress city on the road to Egypt.

Philip was Obedient to the Lord: "And he arose and went";

Abraham obeyed God, Gen 22:3

He Was Probably a Gentile – Ethiopian eunuch – Northeastern Africa on the upper Nile River; now the Sudan and modern Ethiopia.

The Gospel Is For All Men: Gal 3:28

He Was a High Ranking Official – a court official of Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, who was in charge of all her treasure;

The Gospel is for all levels of Humanity -

He Was a Religious Man - "and he had come to Jerusalem to worship."

He Was an Inquiring Man – "reading the prophet Isaiah."

 $\$ Saved by Believing, Manifested by Confession, and Testified to by Baptism."

"the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away"; The word snatched – Greek word Harpazo; Latin word Rapture – "caught up", "taken by force"; used 11X in the NT. 2 Cor 12:2; 1 Thess 4:17.

Acts 8:40

Ashdod is 20 miles north of Gaza.

"until he came to Caesarea."; We find him there 20 years later. Acts 21:8-9
