# "Historical Books Of The Bible" Joshua 2:1-24 Wednesday April 11, 2012

#### Josh 2:1-14

God had given the land to Israel, but they had to fight for every square inch.

The Lesson – That being given promises still means human responsibility.

- 1. Verse 1-7 Courageous Faith
- 2. Verses 8-11 Confident Faith
- 3. Verses 12-14 Concerned Faith
- 4. Verses 15-24 Covenant Faith

## 1. Verse 1-7 – Courageous Faith:

Joshua 2:1

Joshua 1:16-18

Neh 2:11-20 – Nehemiah inspected the walls in secret.

James 2:25, Heb. 11:31

She Was A Sinner Like All: "whose name was Rahab," – her name means – "wide"

Her name is in the bloodline of Christ, Matthew 1:5

Joshua 2:2-4

She Acted Out Her Faith, (Faith With Works!)

Joshua 2:5-7

By her lies, she saved the spies' lives. Was this "The end justifies the means?" (Lying) NO! Lying is always wrong because it is a sin.

- 1. We must first believe that God could protect these spies without Rahab's lie.
- 2. Rahab was commended by James for her actions. James 2:25

The Bible records what she did, but does not approve her lies, but her faith in God.

### 2. Verses 8-11 - Confident Faith:

Joshua 2:8-9

Rahab Heard The Word: "and said to the men, 'I know that the Lord has given you the land,'" Exodus 15:13-18

She Believed The Word: God had promised the land to Abraham's descendants, Gen 15:18-21

Heb. 11:7

Rahab knew that Jehovah was the true God – Intellect

Rahab feared when she heard all that God had done and that they were coming – Emotions

Rahab received the spies and pleaded for salvation – The Will

She Was Under Condemnation: "and that the terror of you has fallen on us,"

Joshua 2:10-11

Rahab gives the inside information about the people melting over Israel coming into the land. Fulfillment of a word from Moses (Exodus 15:13-18)

#### 3. Verses 12-14 - Concerned Faith:

Joshua 2:12

Kindly – 250X in O.T. it means "to be loyal, steadfast, faithful love based on an unwritten promise, agreement or covenant."

Joshua 2:13-14

There were 3 conditions that Rahab would have to keep in order for her to be saved:

- 1. The family must stay in the house during the assault. (Verse -19)
- 2. A scarlet cord or yarn was to hang from the very window that the spies were delivered through. (Verse-18)
- 3. The mission of the spies must be kept secret. (Verse-20)

### 4. Verses 15-24 - Covenant Faith:

Joshua 2:15

"was on the city wall, so that she was living on the wall." – There were 2 walls that were separated by 15 feet. The people put planks across them and then built homes on them.

Joshua 2:16

"Go to the hill country" – The mountain region of limestone cliffs and caves of Jericho 1/2 mile west; Northwest corner of the Dead Sea. This is the same area that 20 centuries later in a cave, there would be found "The Dead Sea Scrolls."

Joshua 2:17-18

It was not faith in the rope, but faith in God, (Rope was sign of belief)

Ex. 12:13

Joshua 2:19

John 10:9

Joshua 2:20

This agreement was a personal one. It was one between Rahab and the spies. Each one of us must make our own commitments.

Joshua 2:21

"and she tied the scarlet cord in the window." – <u>She did not hesitate</u> but immediately took the steps to be saved.

Joshua 2:22-24

# Application:

- 1. That Being Given Promises From God, Does Not Nullify Human Responsibility.
- 2. We Need To Be Encouraged That God Is Working In Some Of The Most Unlikely Places, With Some Of The Most Unlikely People.
- 3. When Rahab's Name Is Mentioned, It Is Always With The Fact Of Her Being A Harlot. This Is Not To Demean Her, But To Speak Of God's Great Grace Towards Those Who Sin. It Matters Not What Sin We Commit, For God Can Forgive
