**Hebrew title Judges –** "rulers, deliverers, or saviors"; "Liberating and delivering." God raised up <u>12 Men</u> and <u>1 Woman</u>, which were called Judges.

**The Author** – The author is anonymous. The traditional view is that it was Samuel.

**When Written** – Written after the death of Joshua. The period of 1380-1045 BC. Judges extends another 30 years as it includes Samuel. 300-350 years

Where it was Written - Canaan

**Purpose** – To cover the period of time from the death of Joshua to Samuel and the Kings. Through Joshua, God gave victory to nations; in Judges, individuals. 13 Judges are named.

The book centers around 7 cycles of oppression and deliverance.

- 1. Israel begins by Sinning against the Lord.
- 2. Because of their disobedience, God raises a nation to put them into Servitude.
- 3. In the midst of their bondage, Israel <u>Supplicates</u> to God for deliverance.
- 4. God raises up a judge to bring Salvation to the nation.
- 5. Once freed, Israel <u>Serves</u> the Lord until the death of that judge.
- 6. Their Stubbornness & Stupidity causes them to repeat the cycle.

Book of Joshua could be called the "Book of Conquest"; Judges could be called "The Book of Failure"

**Theme** – "No King"; Basic lesson: Obedience brings God's blessing; Disobedience brings God's discipline! Or "The Faithfulness of the Covenant-keeping God and the Unfaithfulness of His Covenant-breaking people"
