**Judges 7:1-8** 

Judges 6-8 - is the account of Gideon

Judges 6 – Before God uses Gideon, God had to get his own personal life in order.

Gideon would have to renounce sin personally before he could lead the nation of Israel to victory.

The Holy Spirit came upon him to empower him.

God began to assemble additional men around him.

The enemy of faith is Self-Confidence; Trust or reliance in one's own abilities! God want's ever-increasing Dependence upon Him.

### 1. Verses 1-8 – The Preparation Of The Army:

Judges 7:1

Jerubbaal – "the Baal fighter, Baal conqueror"; Gideon is empowered by the Spirit according to Judges 6:34

Judges 8:10 – they numbered 132,000 people.

Judges 7:3 – 32,000, Judges 8:10 – they numbered 132,000

#### Judges 7:3

The First Test – The Test Of Fearlessness: "Whoever is afraid and trembling, let him return and depart from Mount Gilead."

Why did God want the fearful people to leave?

- 1. The origin and nature of fear: Fear comes from focusing on the problem and not on God, who is bigger than any problem.
- 2. Fear is contagious.
- 3. God had already given a standing order for fearlessness in battle.

The Second Test – The Test of Single-Mindedness: Judges 7:4

God was looking for people who had a sense of urgency & fervency. He wanted people with an intense devotion or attentiveness to the task.

"laps the water with his tongue, as a dog laps," – Would they place their human needs without regard to the enemy at hand?

"as well as everyone who kneels to drink." – They were alert and ever mindful of the enemy.

### 2. Verses 9-15 - The Preparation Of Gideon:

Judges 7:9

The Command – "Arise, go down against the camp,"

The Promise Was That Of Victory – "for I have given it into your hands."

Judges 7:10-13

Barley – is poor man's food, the food of slaves and animals.

Physically – Israel had no food; it was constantly taken by the Midianites.

Spiritually – Israel had become slaves, eating slave food rather than victorious conquerors eating the rich bounty of the land

That night Gideon came to the realization that it wasn't him & his 300 against the 135,000 Midianites, BUT it was God

### 3. Verses 16-25 - The Battle And Victory:

The Weapons: horns (To Blow), empty pitchers (To Shatter), torches (To Shine), a voice (To Shout) – no swords, arrows or shields!
