Leviticus 17:1-8 The Offering of Food: Lev 17:1-4

Lev 17:11

Any animal used for food had to be brought to the altar and presented as a fellowship (peace) offering to the Lord.

Lev 17:5

1. By bringing the animal to the altar, the offerer was seeing to it that the Lord (3:1-17) and the priest (7:11-18) each received their rightful portion.

Lev 17:6

2. By this law the Lord dignified ordinary meals and made them a sacred experience.

2 Cor 2:16

3. This kept the people from secretly offering sacrifices to idols out in the fields.

Application:

- 1. God sets the standards, not man nor society. God is both the creator, and the sustainer.
