Leviticus 1-7 The Offerings To The Lord: There are <u>5 Offerings</u> and <u>each</u> one is a Picture of Jesus Christ.

The difference is that when these offerings were given, they were given to Israel: Lev 1:1-2

These same sacrifices are repeated and additional instruction is given to the priests: Lev 6:8

1. Lev 6:8-13 The Burnt Offering:

Burnt Offering - burnt offering: "That which ascends, that which goes up"; It is called "The Whole burnt offering"; Jesus gave all for us; The worshipper is to be taught that entire consecration is essential to true worship.

2. Lev 6:14-23 The Grain Offering:

Lev 6:14

Grain Offering - Represents Jesus Christ as the Bread of Life: The Grain Offering was Voluntary – The Grain Offering was a Product of the Soil – The grain represents the fruit of our labor; All that we do is to be dedicated unto God.

3. Lev 6:24-30 The Sin Offering:

Lev 6:24-25

Sins – Hebrew and Greek word both mean, "missing the mark"; we have come to see this as an archer that shoots an arrow at the target that gets close but not exactly.

Sin Offering – The sacrifice of animals can't take away sin or change the human heart; Jesus was our sin offering, who was slaughtered outside the camp (city) denied the presence of His Father because He became sin for us. Jesus was the perfect Sacrifice, bringing forgiveness of sin.

4. Lev 7:1-10 The Trespass Offering:

Lev 7:1

The Trespass (Guilt, Reparation) Offering - emphasized the damage done to others by the (Sinner) offender. Speaks of restitution for the damage of sin.

The Trespass (Guilt) Offering — "But the Lord was pleased To crush Jesus, putting Him to grief; If He would render Himself as a guilt offering. How costly sin is and it's cleansing. Our sins hurt God and hurt others. True repentance will always bring with it a desire for restitution. We will want to make things right with God and with those whom we've sinned against."

5. Lev 7:11-34 The Fellowship Offering:

Lev 7:11

After dealing with the "Sin Offering" and "Trespass Offering", we come to the "Fellowship Peace Offering."

Fellowship Offering – Pictures Jesus Christ as our peace, the reality that the forgiveness of sins brings peace and communion with God and with God's people, and joyful thanksgiving of worship to God.
