So God has given to us four Gospels. The first 3 are **Matthew, Mark,** and **Luke** are called the <u>"Synoptic Gospels."</u> Synoptic is made up of two Greek words meaning, *"To see, together."*

The Author - Colossians 4:14

Acts 1:1 Theophilus - "Loved by God, Lover of God"

Audience – The Greeks.

When Written -

Purpose – Luke 1:4

Theme - "Jesus the Perfect Man,"

Matthew - was written to the <u>Jews.</u> The theme is "Jesus Christ king of the Jews."

Mark - was written to the <u>Romans.</u> The theme is "The servant who rules."

John – Takes flight. That we might believe. The theme is "The deity of Jesus Christ." There are 7 signs, there are 7 "I Am", the word "believe is used 98 times. The information given in this Gospel is 93% is not in the other Gospels.

Luke is the longest gospel not in the number of chapters but in verses.
