The Danger of interpreting difficulties as the Holy Spirit's "Prohibitions"

# 1. Verses 1-6 – Miletus To Tyre:

"parted" - means "tore ourselves away"

"Rhodes" - "the isle of roses", southeast of Cos

Acts 21:2-3

"to Syria and landed at Tyre" – a major port on the trans-Mediterranean merchant ships. This is a distance of about 400 miles.

"looking up" - "He diligently searched out"

"through the Spirit" – means that the Spirit (Prediction, Warning, Heads Up) told them that Paul would undergo suffering for Christ, a message that naturally gave the believers deep concern. God was showing these believers that something that looked bad was going to happen.

The Holy Spirit's Prediction Versus Prohibition:

Why was Paul Encountering Such Pressure From His Friends to Go Against What He Knew to be God's Will?

- 1. Paul's Acquaintances Practiced The Common Disposition of Being Quick to Know God's Will For Someone Else:
- 2. Well-Meaning Believers Were Trying to Make God's Will Conform To Their Preconceptions:
- 3. Attempting to Turn Paul From Jerusalem, His Friends Demonstrated Their Spiritual Focus Was More On The Horizontal Than The Vertical:

Paul's Determination: For I am <u>ready not only to be bound</u>, but <u>even to</u> <u>die</u> at Jerusalem for the name of the Lord Jesus."
