"Never Stop Praying" Luke 18:1-8 Sunday September 17, 2017

Jesus presents a parable, which is "A Call To Pray!" To <u>Pray At All Times</u> and <u>Don't Lose Heart</u> which is needed for the long haul.

This parable presents contrasts; Like Luke 11:5-8. The Context of The Parable: Jesus had given a prophetic discourse on the Last Days. **Deception**, **Destruction** and **Destiny** of those on earth.

The Thought Of Our Passage: "Jesus Calls The Believer To Be Persistent And Patient In Prayer Because God Wants To Answer."

- 1. Verse 1 The Appeal
- 2. Verses 2-5 The Parable
- 3. Verses 6-8 The Application

1. Verse 1 – The Appeal:

Luke 18:1

"Now" – The Context is Luke 17:20-37 – Dealing with the question, Luke 17:20 – "when the kingdom of God was coming,"

Luke 17:37

"He was telling them a parable" – A parable was an illustration that was given along side of teaching to force the listeners to make a decision. It was to draw the listener in and, by surprise, they see themselves and God.

Purpose Of The Parable – At All Times We Should Pray: "to show that at all times they <u>ought to</u> (should) pray"

1 Thessalonians 5:17

Purpose Of The Parable – Don't Lose Heart: "and not to lose heart," – faint; literally "to be filled with bad thoughts."

Jesus presents 2 options to His disciples living in difficult days – <u>Pray</u> or Faint!

2. Verses 2-5 - The Parable:

Luke 18:2 – "In a certain city there was a judge"

"a judge who did not fear God," – Godless; If this man was a Jew, he was rebelling against the qualifications of a judge, 2 Chronicles 19:6-7.

"and did not respect man." – This is the wrong man for this position.

Here is a godless man that does not respect people that is supposed to be upholding the laws of God.

Luke 18:3

Jesus uses a "Widow" and a "Judge" to illustrate difficult times, and the obstacles that one could face in the last days!

3 Obstacles Facing This Woman:

1. The Obstacle Of Being a Woman:

Being a woman she had little standing before the law.

A woman that was a widow, she had no husband to stand with her in court, Exodus 22:22-24.

She was probably poor and could not pay a bribe.

"and she kept coming to him," – Notice that none of these things deterred her.

Ruth 1:20-21 – "Do not call me Naomi; ("Pleasant") call me Mara, ("Bitter")"

2. The Obstacle Of An Adversary: "saying, 'Give me legal protection from my opponent.'"

We have a spiritual adversary, James 4:7.

Psalms 94:16; 2 Thessalonians 3:2-3

Luke 18:4

3. The Obstacle Of A Judge: "For a while he was unwilling;" – This parable teaches us to be prepared for the injustices of life.

Luke 18:5 – "yet because this widow bothers me, I will give her legal protection," – "She found him everywhere, on the streets, at his home, at the market place, and when he went to church."

"lest by continually coming she wear me out." – which literally means "give me a black eye; poke at my eye!" Get in my face!

Judge will grant her request, not for fear of God, not for Human-Kindness, but for the sake of Patience.

3. Verses 6-8 – The Application:

Luke 18:6

Our Lord is saying, "When you come to God in prayer, do not think of God as this unjust judge!"

Consider 5 Contrasts Between This Unrighteous Judge And God:

- 1. The woman was a stranger, but we are the children of God, and God cares for His children: Luke 11:13.
- 2. The woman had no access to the judge, but God's children have an open access into His presence: Hebrews 4:14-16.
- 3. The woman had no friend in court, but the believer has an Advocate in heaven, the Savior Jesus Christ: 1 John 2:1.
- 4. The woman had no promises that she could claim; when the believer prays, we can open the Word and claim the many promises of God: Romans 8:26-27.
- 5. The widow came to a court of law, but God's children come to a throne of grace: Hebrews 4:14-16.

3 Suggestions how to develop persistence like this widow:

1. A Sense Of Duty – All of life is <u>not filled with pleasures</u>, but rather <u>obligations</u>.

Society and the Church is filled with people that live for <u>pleasure</u> versus obligations!

Believers have a calling from God!

2. When Knocked Down, Don't Stay Down — Develop a form of resiliency, even when life deals you a blow, you get back up charging.

Proverbs 24:16

3. Stay Focused On God's Eternal Plan – The troubles of this world are temporary, but the glory of our Lord and Savior is forever, Romans 8:18.

Luke 18:7 – "now will not God bring about justice for His elect," – This remark is stated emphatically with a double negative; "God will definitely vindicate his people."

Justice – "vindication, protection."

Romans 12:19

What we often miss is God's concern of the persistent prayer for His coming Kingdom. Matthew 6:10 – "Your kingdom come."

Luke 18:8 – "However, when the Son of Man comes, will He find faith on the earth?" – The question is in reference to Luke 17:22-37 – "Shall He find [that kind of] faith on the earth?" We need to pray and not quit.

Application:

- 1. Difficult Days Call For Prayer. If We Don't Pray, We Will Faint And Lose Heart.
- 2. In Order To Stay Persistent In Prayer, We Must Have A Sense Of Duty (Be Responsible).
- 3. In Order To Stay Persistent In Prayer, We Need Determination That If Knocked Down, We Will Not Stay Down.
- 4. In Order To Stay Persistent In Prayer, We Must Stay Focused On God's Eternal Plan: His Kingdom Come!
