God is determined once and for all to settle the issue of Aaron's Authority as priest!

Rod or Staff – was always a symbol of authority. A shepherd used it to guide and correct his sheep – Psalm 23:4

Ex. 17:9

Jesus Christ, God's ultimate authority, God incarnate, is called a Rod – Isaiah 11:1-2

Numbers 17:6-13 - God's Choice: Numbers 17:6-11

The Rod (Jesus God's Authority) a jar of Manna (Provision, Jesus – The Bread of Life) and the 10 Commandments (Requirements, Jesus – The Fulfillment of the Law)

Numbers 15-17 – Deals With Authority – you <u>shall bear the guilt in</u> <u>connection with the sanctuary</u>; There is a Biblical Principle that states; Luke 12:48 "To whom much is given, much is required"

Responsibility is the other side of the coin of Authority!

Nadab & Abihu, Lev 10

The priesthood was to keep God's dwelling pure and protect it from the iniquity that may taint it.

Numbers 18:4

The Levites – were to serve the priesthood. They were to be "joined" with you; the name Levi means "attached" or "joined"

Numbers 18:5-6

Lev 10:6 – Aaron and to his sons Eleazar and Ithamar

Numbers 18:7

"but the outsider who comes near shall be put to death."

- 1. If the Levites overstepped their bounds, judgment would come and they would die.
- 2. If the Priest allowed a Levite to practice the office of the priests. The priest would be judged and die.

Numbers 18:8-19 – The Priests Provision: Numbers 18:8-19

Numbers 18:19 – It is an everlasting covenant of salt

There are 3 meanings behind the image of the salt:

- 1. Salt is a Very Pure Compound This covenant was to remain pure; nothing added or taken away.
- 2. Salt is a Preservative This speaks of the covenant being an enduring one.
- 3. Salt was Expensive This was a valuable covenant.

While the priests lived off the offerings, the <u>Levites were to live off the tithes</u> of the people.

Malachi makes it clear that when the people didn't bring their tithes, it wasn't the Levites they were robbing but God.
