Numbers 15-17 – God Reaffirms His Authority in His Word and in His Leaders:

Numbers 18 – The Provisions for the Priests and Levites:

The Priests – received the offerings made to the Lord – they were regarded as holy

The Levites – received the tithes of the people

Numbers 19:1-22 - A Pure People Numbers 20:1-29 - Old And New

Numbers 19:1-22 - A Pure People:

Ceremonial lessons about sin, and the wages of sin

Numbers 19:1-10 – The Purification Sacrifice: Numbers 19:1-2

"red heifer" – The red color may point to the blood being shed

Gen. 2:7 – The name "Adam" comes from the Hebrew word which means "red earth."

"heifer" – is a cow that has not yet born a calf; A cow, not a bull, is the victim

Numbers 19:3-6

cedar wood and hyssop and scarlet material, all of which were used in the cleansing ceremony for a healed leper Lev. 14:4, 6, 49, 51-52;

Numbers 19:7-10

Notice that all involved in this process became unclean!

Jesus is the Heifer – He was perfect, without defect or blemish, never being under the bondage/yoke of sin.

Jesus Alone Is The One Who Brings Forth Life: John 10:10

The procedure of the sacrifice foreshadowed Jesus' death: Jesus was killed outside of the city of Jerusalem.

The 3 added elements also foreshadowed His death:

- 1. The cedar wood is a picture of the cross, (cedar speaks of healing)
- 2. The hyssop was the applicator for the blood Passover & sprinkling on the Mercy seat, purification.
- 3. Scarlet the emblem of sin Isa 1:18; Sin as scarlet

Jesus Himself, by His sacrifice, cleansed and purified us from our sin: Heb 9:12-15

We should cleanse ourselves: 2 Cor 7:1

God promises forgiveness and cleansing to His children if they turn from their sins and confess them to the Lord: 1 John 1:9

Numbers 20:1-29 - Old And New:

Num 20:1

As we move to Numbers 20, we move ahead 38 years! The entire record of Israel's wanderings is covered in Numbers 14-19

Numbers 33:38

When Moses died at the end of the fortieth year, Deut. 1:3

"and the people stayed at Kadesh." – Notice they are back in Kadesh. This is the place from where the spies went into Canaan and then returned and refused to enter.

They have come full circle! The only thing they accomplished was to waste time!
