Vow - was a promise to dedicate something to God or to do something for God. A vow involved an obligation to do: a bond, an obligation, to forbear doing.

Oath - was a promise to exclude oneself from a privilege or enjoyment.

- 1. Was it Sin To Not Settle In The Promised Land? NO. Nowhere do we read that what Gad, Reuben, and the half-tribe Manasseh requested was a sin against God
- 2. The Promised Land is Not Heaven, but a Picture of the Victorious Christian life: (Don't earn it)
- 3. The Offer to Enter into The Promised Land is Available, but God Doesn't Force People
- 4. The 2 ¹/₂ Tribes Were Still Part of Israel, But They Were Not Enjoying the Full Benefits of What God Had to Offer Them
