1. Numbers 7 – A Generous Gift:

Numbers 7:1-9 The Oxen And Carts: Numbers 7:1-2

The longest chapter in the Bible is Psalm 119 which deals with God's Word; The 2nd longest chapter in the Bible is Num 7. This deals with giving unto the Lord.

On twelve successive days, each of the tribal leaders brought identical gifts.

Numbers 7:4-8

Numbers 4:29-33 The Merarites: They had the heavy things – the boards and frames,

Merarites received more because their burden was heavier.

Notice that the Kohatites didn't get any carts – why?

The fact that God noted and recorded each name and each gift indicates His love for and interest in the individual believer.

2. Numbers 8 – The Ordination of The Levites:

Numbers 8:1-4 The Lampstands Arrangement: Num 8:1-2

- 1. It was Practical There were no windows in the tabernacle. The only source of light was the lampstand.
- Our Motives of Serving The Lord is more concerned with our motives. Our hearts and motives will always be exposed to the light of God.

Numbers 8:3

"mounted its lamps at the front of the lampstand,"; so that the light would shine on the table of showbread and be diffused throughout the holy place.

Fellowship and Light (Truth Illumination) always go together – 1 John 1:5-7

What did this lampstand signify? Symbol of Jesus Christ, the Light of the world (John 8:12).

The lampstand was a reminder to the priests that Israel was called to be a light to the Gentile world (Isa. 42:6; 49:6).

Numbers 8:4

The oil for the lamps is a symbol of the Holy Spirit of God who alone can empower us to witness effectively for Christ.
