**Numbers** – takes its name from the two numberings of the men for war in Numbers 1-4 and 26-27.

**Numbers** – Israel is tested in trusting God and found guilty of the sin of Unbelief.

Numbers 9:1-5 - The Second Passover: Numbers 9:1

If we compare Numbers 9:1 to Numbers 1:1:

Numbers 1:1 says the 1st day of the 2nd month of the 2nd year Numbers 9:1 says the 1st month of the 2nd year

Why is it out of sequence? – Because of Numbers 9:6-14: God wanted all the people to celebrate it.

Numbers 9:6-14 – Special Provision For The Passover: Num 9:6-11

"unleavened bread" – Did not have time for the bread to rise, and leaven symbolizes sin.

"and bitter herbs." – Reminds Israel of the bitterness of Egypt, slavery.

Numbers 9:15-23 – The Guidance Of God: Numbers 9:15

Exodus 13:21-22 – as the children of Israel left Egypt.

Numbers 9:16

- 1. By day it was a cloud helped shield them from the blazing sun of the desert
- 2. By night it was fire Pillar lit the way, but also provided warmth at night

Numbers 9:17 - cloud: this is the Hebrew word "shekinah"

Note the phrase "command of the Lord" used 7X in this section

Numbers 9:19-23

- 1. Lesson of The Pillar And Cloud The Pillar was a constant visual reminder of the presence of God among Israel:

## God Gave 4 Purposes For The Trumpets:

- 1. Verses 3-4 The Trumpet Was Used To Gather God's People:
- 2. Verses 5-8 Used To Direct The Camp:
- 3. Verse 9 Used To Sound An Alarm For Battle:

In essence, it was a reminder of Israel's dependence upon God!

4. Verse 10 – Used To Announce The Feasts:

These trumpets were considered the voice of God.
