#1 Commandment: Exodus 20:1-3

Exodus 19:1-2 – we have the setting for "The Ten Commandments."

The first 4 Commandments deal with Our (Reverence) of God:

- 1. Have no other gods The Object of Worship.
- 2. Shall not make a graven image True form of Worship.
- 3. Shall not take the name of the Lord our God in vain Perpetual Worship.
- 4. Remember the Sabbath day to keep holy Time to Worship.

The next 6 Commandments deal with our (respect) of man!

This first commandment is the key to opening all the others. It starts with putting God first.

1. Why Are We Told To Have No Other Gods?

Exodus 20:1-2

"I am the LORD" – Jehovah, "Self-Existent or Eternal," your God, Elohim "the Supreme God."

This brings man into the presence of "Self-Existent or Eternal, the Supreme God." God Is Revealed Through Creation – Genesis 1:1.

God Is Revealed Through Judgment – Romans 1:18.

"who brought you" – "the second person singular," which means that "God is addressing each person by name."

It is important that we receive each one of these Ten Commandments as God's gift of love to us.

1# Commandment – verse 3: "You shall have no other gods before Me." (Preeminence)

Psalm 14:1 Romans 1:18-23 Psalms 19:1

There is no middle ground. Either we are <u>a worshipper of the true God</u>, or we are <u>worshippers of a false God</u>.

This Commandment starts with the reality of God; That God is God.

Psalmists – do not argue God; they realize who He is and <u>rejoice in His</u> <u>mercies</u>. The prophets – don't prove God but <u>proclaim Him</u>. Jesus – never proved the existence of God, <u>He revealed Him</u>.

Exodus 20:3 – "You shall have no other gods before Me." – Literal translation would read, "If you will let all other gods go, then you shall have me."

1 Corinthians 8:4

Idolatry – is substituting someone or something in the place of God.

God demands first place in our lives because of <u>who He is</u>: Exodus 20:2.

"I am" – He is eternal, past, and future. He is the eternal God.

All that we would ever have need of, God is.

God demands first place in our lives because of <u>what He has done</u>: Exodus 20:2.

God Is The One And Only.

God Proved That He Was One.

God Is Gracious.

<u>3. How Do We Guard Against Other Gods</u>? How do we guard against other gods? By a choice!

<u>4. How To Know The True God</u>: God wanted His People to think and be Monotheistic (Belief of One God).

Positive – That if we have no other gods; but with the Lord we have the positive, "We shall have Him!"
