1. Verse 1 - The Position Of The Pastor:

1 Tim 3:1

"It is a trustworthy statement": A literal translation is "faithful is the word"

"if any man aspires" — "to covet, to reach out after, to stretch oneself toward, to aspire to"

"it is a fine work he desires to do." - stresses "an intense emotional desire"

"overseer," – According to the <u>New Testament, there are 3 Terms</u>: "Overseer (Bishop)," "Pastor," and "Elder" are used synonymously.

1 Peter 5:1-2

- 1. Bishop means "Overseer"; It is derived from two verbs that mean "to visit" or "to look upon, to inspect as an overseer or a superintendent, or in modern terms, a foreman"
- 2. "Elder" is the translation of the Greek word which means "an old man"; reflects the "maturity and dignity of the office"; Mature people with spiritual wisdom and experience.
- 3. "Pastor" means "Shepherd"; "one who leads and cares for the flock of God."

The English translation "Pastor" is found only once in the New Testament (Eph. 4:11).

John 10:11

Heb. 13:20

The Work: "it is a fine work he desires to do."

- 1. A Pastor is to Shepherd and to Feed.
- 2. The "Overseer" is to give oversight to the church and to guard the church from the inroads of error; Protecting Acts 20:29-31

Example to the flock – 1 Peter 5:2

3. The term "elder" refers to the individual's position and to the respect others give him.

2. Verses 2-7 - Qualification Of A Pastor:

1 Tim 3:2

Verses 2-3 – Moral Qualities: "above reproach," – The adjective "blameless" serves as a general description of the person's life.

The adjective literally means "not to be taken upon." "Nothing brought against him will stick. He must be "un-rebuke able"

1 Tim 3:7

Marital Qualification: "the husband of one wife," – Literally reads "one-woman man"

The pastoral candidate cannot have more than one living wife. The phrase therefore prohibits non-biblical divorce and remarriage; Truly a one woman man, no other woman, no other woman in his life but his wife.

"temperate" – sober "A clear-headed person" is "one who is wise, and cautious. He is alert to what is going on around him, and yet he is calm."

"prudent" – literally means "sound-minded, Self-controlled, A sober person thinks straight. He is not mentally confused"

"respectable" - Orderly, "of good behavior, not chaos"

"hospitable" – literally means "a lover of strangers"

"able to teach" – A pastor must be "apt to teach, willing and able to teach", 2 Timothy 2:24

A Teacher Must First Be Taught: 1 Timothy 4:6

2 Timothy 2:2

1 Tim 3:3

"not addicted to wine" – The phrase literally reads "not beside wine, not lingering with the cup, drunkenness"

"pugnacious," - Not Violent, "not a giver of blows"

"gentle," – better rendering "patient, fair" A pastor must be actively considerate toward those who have mistreated him and who differ with his policies.

"uncontentious," – (Peaceful) not quarrelsome; Greek word "amachos" we get Macho. The pastor must not be "without war"; Noncombatant. 2 Timothy 2:24-25

Proverbs 16:32

"free from the love of money." – The Greek word literally means "not a lover of silver."

1 Timothy 6:10

Verses 4-5 – Home Life: 1 Tim 3:4

1. The Pastor Must Rule Well: "He must be one who manages his own household well,"

The pastor manages; The verb means "to stand before."

2. The Pastor Must Parent Well: "keeping his children under control" – The children – "those who have not yet attained adulthood"

Three features of the Pastor's Fatherhood are presented:

- 1. His Control Of His Children Must Be Constant: "keeping his children" The present tense of the verb "keeping" stresses the habit of his life.
- 2. The Children Must Be Under Control "in subjection"
- 3. The Pastor Must Parent with all dignity, "with all gravity", Ephesians 6:4

Verse 5 - A Poor Father Will Not Make A Good Pastor: 1 Tim 3:5

Verse 6 – Spiritual Maturity (Time): 1 Tim 3:6

"a new convert," - literally means a "new plant", "novice"

2 Dangers For a Premature Position of Leadership:

- 1. The Pastor Could become conceited, "lifted up with pride"
- 2. The Pastor could fall into the condemnation incurred by the devil.

1 Timothy 5:22

Verse 7 – Public Reputation (Impact): 1 Tim 3:7

2 Problems With A Person Without A Good Reputation From The Lost:

- 1. He Could Fall Into "reproach"; Reproaches are verbal accusations hurled at another.
- 2. The Pastor Could Fall Into the snare of the devil. Satan could use a fault.

Application:

- 1. The Quality and Faithfulness of the Man, Determines the Teaching and the Very Direction of the Church.
- 2. The Office of Overseer Demands the Dual Responsibilities of Pastoring and Teaching.
- 3. The Pastor Must Be Above Reproach Nothing brought against Him Will Stick.
- 4. Being A Poor Father, Hastening Spiritual Maturity, and A Poor Public Reputation Will Result in A Negative Impact For God And The Church.
