1. Verses 1-4 - The Christian's Weakness:

Acts 12:1

"Herod the king" – Herod Agrippa $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ who was the grandson of Herod the Great.

This is the 5th Recorded Persecution Against the Church:

- 1. With the Sadducees, elders, rulers, and scribes. Acts 4
- 2. With Sadducees alone because of preaching of the resurrection. Acts 5
- 3. With the synagogue of the Libertines brought Stephen to trial, Acts 6
- 4. With Saul headed intense persecution that scattered the church. Acts 8
- 5. Now Herod Agrippa. (Political Powers) Acts 12

Acts 12:2

This is James the son of Zebedee, the older brother of John.

Mark 10:39

Acts 1:8 witnesses – "You shall be martyrs"; James – first Apostle to be martyred.

2. Verses 5-17 - God's Unlimited Power:
