Series "Living God Gives A Living Hope" "Redemption" 1 Peter 1:18-21 Study-5

The Lord established the Lord's Supper so that regularly, His people would remember that He died for them 1 Corinthians 11:24.

"redeemed" – "to liberate by payment of ransom, to cause to be released by payment of the ransom, to deliver, to be set free."

Thought Of The Passage: Our Redemption Was God's Greatest And Most Costly Work, Accomplished Through The Giving Of His Only Son.

<u>1. Verse 18 – Reminder Of – What We Were</u> <u>2. Verse 19 – Reminder Of – What Jesus Did</u> <u>3. Verse 20 – Reminder Of – When God Made His Plan</u> <u>4. Verse 21 – Reminder Of – Who To Trust</u>

1. Verse 18 – Reminder Of – What We Were:

1 Peter 1:18 – "knowing that you were not redeemed" – Context – Peter left off with "The Pursuit Of Holiness," 1 Peter 1:17.

We are to be holy – "knowing that you were not redeemed" – The old expression "How You Going To Act?" 2 Corinthians 7:1

"knowing" – "to see, be aware, behold, consider, perceive, be sure, to understand;" that you were not redeemed with perishable things.

The word "redeemed" – <u>There were probably 60 million slaves in the</u> <u>Roman Empire</u>.

Peter is speaking of our life of slavery to sin, the bondage of sin, Titus 3:3.

Moses urged Israel to remember that they had been slaves in Egypt, Deuteronomy 5:15; 16:12; 24:18; 24:22.

The generation that died in the wilderness forgot the bondage of Egypt and wanted to go back! Numbers 11:4-6

Romans 6:6, 17-18, 20

"with perishable things like silver or gold" – Meaning that they don't last or have value forever.

"silver or gold" – provide a false sense of security, Ecclesiastes 12:8.

"from your futile way of life" – the word "futile" – "empty, profitless, vain, vanity, striving for something that is never achieved."

Paul described the wisdom of the world using the same word: 1 Corinthians 3:20 – "empty, profitless."

Unsaved people are blindly living on substitutes: 1 Peter 4:1-4.

"inherited from your forefathers," – The readers had come out of the world, with its empty pursuits, Ephesians 2:1-3"

2. Verse 19 - Reminder Of - What Jesus Did:

1 Peter 1:19

The Great Cost To God: "but" – This word points back to "Redeemed," the true means of Redemption! – "with precious blood," – 1 Peter 1:18 – "not <u>redeemed</u> with perishable things" – To redeem means "to set free by paying a price, to liberate." 100X OT – only 3X NT, Luke 24:21; Titus 2:14; 1 Peter 1:18. Several words built on the root word, "ransom, redemption."

<u>No amount of money can set a lost sinner free</u>. Only the precious blood. The term "precious" – "costly, highly esteemed, to be held in honor." The price of redemption was exceedingly costly to almighty God, Isaiah 52:3.

Leviticus 17:11

Peter was a Witness of Christ's Sufferings: 1 Peter 5:1.

Peter mentioned His sacrificial death often in this letter – 1 Peter 2:21; 1 Peter 3:18.

"as of a lamb" – Peter is reminding his readers of the Doctrine of Substitution: an innocent victim giving his life for the guilty.

The Doctrine of Sacrifice: begins in Genesis 3, when God killed animals that He might clothe Adam and Eve, Genesis 3:21.

Abraham was to offer up Isaac. Isaac asked the question, "Where is the lamb?" Genesis 22:7-8

God provided a substitute; a ram died for Isaac, Genesis 22:13.

Passover lamb was slain for each Jewish household, Exodus 12:3,13.

Messiah was presented as an innocent Lamb in Isaiah 53:7.

John the Baptist pointed to Jesus, John 1:29.

In heaven, the redeemed and the angels sing, Revelation 5:11-14.

"unblemished" – "Without personal sin" – "and spotless," – "not defiled by contact with sinners" – "the blood of Christ." – Exodus 12:5.

3. Verse 20 – Reminder Of – When God Made His Plan:

1 Peter 1:20

History Is His-Story: "For He was foreknown before the foundation of the world," – Peter made it clear that <u>Christ's death was an appointment</u>, <u>not an accident</u>, Acts 2:23; Revelation 13:8.

"foundation of the world," – "Before the creation of the world, before the material universe."

God's plan of salvation was not revealed until the fulness of time: Galatians 4:4.

From the human perspective, our Lord was cruelly murdered; but from the divine perspective, He laid down His life for sinners: John 10:17-18.

"but has appeared in these last times" – "the final age of all periods of human history;" The birth of Jesus to the Second Coming, Hebrews 9:26.

"for the sake of you" – These truths apply to Us! And must be personalized.

<u>4. Verse 21 – Reminder Of – Who To Trust:</u>

1 Peter 1:21 – "who through Him (Jesus Christ) are believers in God," – John 14:6.

"who raised Him from the dead" – The Resurrection is the <u>greatest act for</u> <u>our assurance and hope</u>.

The Gospel message with just the death and burial of Jesus is incomplete. It must include the resurrection! A dead Messiah can help no one! Romans 1:4

1 Peter 1:3

Peter also knew the joy of the Resurrection. It was <u>Peter</u> who ran with <u>John</u> to the tomb where Jesus had been laid – it was empty! John 20.

Peter, on the Day of Pentecost when he was filled with the Holy Spirit, the resurrection power of Jesus Christ flooded into his life, Acts 2:36-41.

Romans 8:11

"and gave Him glory," – The word "glory," the Greek word can be translated "honor," "praise," or "worship," 1 Corinthians 10:31.

"so that your faith" – When we come to Christ in faith, we are saved by faith, Ephesians 2:8-9; Hebrews 11:6 – "The just shall live by faith."

"and hope are in God." – But we are not only to live by faith, we are to live the life of hope; Theme of this book! 1 Peter 1:3, 13, now 21.

"to a living hope" – the word "Hope" 5X in the Epistle. Hope – "sure expectation of a future event;" living hope (dynamic) grounded in the Word of God, 1 Peter 1:23.

Application:

- 1. Redemption Is God's Greatest And Most Costly Work That Could Ever Be Accomplished. Knowing This Should Produce In Us A Desire To Be Holy And Hearts Of Gratitude.
- 2. Persons Outside Of Jesus Christ Are Constantly Striving For Meaning And Purpose But Never Achieve It. Jesus Delivers From The Empty Life.
- 3. Peter Makes It Clear That Christ's Death Was An Appointment, Not An Accident.
