Revelation Is Jesus' Answer To The Lord's Prayer: Matthew 6:10

About 1/4 of the Bible is prophecy.

Revelation 1:1 – "The Revelation of Jesus Christ," – "Unveiling, to uncover Jesus Christ"; "Jesus Unveiled"; "His <u>Person</u>,"; "His <u>Power</u>,"; "His <u>Program</u>".

Revelation 1:1 - "the things which must soon take place;"

Background Of Revelation: (Bear With Me!)

Called "The Revelation", not Revelations; <u>"1"</u> Revelation or Apocalypse means: "unveiling, to uncover something hidden, to reveal."

Apocryphal – which means "to hide or cover", Revelation 22:10.

The Theme Of Revelation: "To uncover, or reveal Jesus Christ", Revelation 1:1

It's the only book of the Bible that promises blessings to those who **read**, **hear** and **heed its message**, **Revelation 1:2**, **22:7**

There are 4 ways of interpreting the Book of Revelation:

- Pre-ter-ist It is from a Latin word that means "Past"; all the prophecies of the book were fulfilled in the past.
- 2. Idealist Not actual events, expressions of principles forces, active in any age!
- **3. Historical or Continuous-Historical** That throughout church history, this book has been fulfilled.
- **4. Futurist** Prophetic large part prophetic, will take place in the future. **Revelation 4-22 are future!**

Matthew 24:29-31

Revelation Contains Symbolism: Signs are given, which can be more accurate than words which have meanings that change.

Revelation Sometimes Interprets Revelation:

Example: "The Lamp stands", Revelation1:12

Revelation 1:20

Written By: The Apostle John "John Beloved"; He was very close to Jesus Christ. He was called "The Disciple That Jesus Loved."

Revelation 1:1

Revelation 1:4

When Written: 95 AD, The very last book of the Bible written.

Where It Was Written: Island of Patmos; it is a small little island in the Aegean Sea. Revelation 1:9

Who It Was Written To: Believers - Revelation 1:1

The Theme: Victory Of Jesus Christ, Jesus Unveiled (Person & Purpose)

Key Words: "lamb" 29X, "throne" 47X, "seven" 55X, "four" 29X, "twelve" 23X.

Key Verse: Revelation 1:19

The Outline Of The Book:

Thought Of Our Passage: The Book Of Revelation Reveals Jesus, Offering Blessings To Those Who Read, Hear And Obey This Prophecy.

1. Verse 1 - The Title:

Revelation 1:1

"The Revelation" – "unveiling, to uncover, to bring to manifestation."

This is the Opposite of Apocrypha – which means "closed-up" – to hide.

"The Revelation of Jesus Christ" – The Revelation was <u>made by Jesus Christ</u>, The Revelation <u>reveals Jesus Christ</u>, The Revelation <u>belongs to Jesus Christ!</u>

"which God gave Him to show to His bond servants," — "servant who serves by love."

Matthew 24:36

"the things which must soon take place," – The word "must" literally means "It is necessary."

"soon" – word that means instrument refers to "speed of time...suddenly, when it happens it will occur quickly – the time of judgment will come with no delay."

2 Peter 3:10-12

"communicated it" – "signified, given insight, or sign, symbols."

"by His angel to His bond-servant, John" - Chain of Communication.

"John" – Beloved; Son of Zebedee, brother of James, fisherman (Matthew 4:21).

2. Verse 2 - The Testimony:

Revelation 1:2

"who testified" – "Revelation is an eyewitness account" (Not second hand); "testified" – used many times by John, over 30X in his Gospel alone.

John's 3 Testimonies:

- 1. Testified To The Word Of God: "testified to the word of God" (Person) 1 John 1:1
- 2. Testimony Of Jesus Christ: "and to the testimony of Jesus Christ," (Words Of Jesus)
- 3. Testified To All That He Saw: "even to all that he saw."

3. Verse 3 - The Terms:

Revelation 1:3

<u>John's 3-Fold Beatitude</u>: "Blessed" – "how happy, how fortunate"; Matthew 5:1-11 – Sermon on the Mt. Beatitudes

"Blessed is he" - This is the first of "7 Beatitudes in Revelation".

- 1. "Blessed is he (Singular) who reads" "keeps on reading"
- 2. "those (Plural) who hear the words of the prophecy" "keeps on hearing"

"the prophecy" – 7X Revelation is said to be prophecy, "Fore-telling and Forth-telling"; that is speaking forth the mind and counsel of God.

"heed the things which are written in it" – "keeps on obeying", Revelation 22:7

James 1:22

"for the time is near!" - "soon, there is an urgency!"

God's Apparent Delay! 2 Peter 3:15

2 Timothy 3:13

Application:

- God Wants The Believer To Understand Revelation. The Revelation Of Jesus Christ Means "The Unveiling, To Uncover Jesus Christ."
- 2. The Futurist Interpretation Of Revelation Takes The Scriptures As Literal; That God Meant What He Said. Much Of Revelation Is Future, "The Things Which Must Soon Take Place."
- 3. Revelation Is Unique In That It Offers Blessings To Those Who Read, Hear And Obey This Prophecy.
- 4. True Bible Prophecy Does Not Lead One To Neglect The Practical Things Of The Christian Life; Blessed Are The Balanced.
