"Seeking The Christ Of Christmas" Matthew 2:1-12

Matthew's account of the birth of Jesus (Advent of Christ) Reveals the Attitudes/Response to His coming.

Herod – Opposed The King!

Religious Leaders & Citizens of Jerusalem – Ignored The King!

The Magi – <u>Seek The King</u>! "Seeking The Christ of Christmas!"

<u>1. Verses 1-10 – The Wise Will Seek Him</u> <u>2. Verses 11-12 – The Wise Will Find Him</u>

1. Verses 1-10 – The Wise Will Seek Him:

Matthew 2:1 – "Now" – Matthew 1 covered Jesus's <u>lineage</u> (His right to the throne), then His <u>supernatural advent</u> (born of a virgin); The King is "The King of Kings."

"after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea" – This is all that Matthew says about the birth details. Luke 2:1-20 gives details as to the very night!

"in the days of Herod the king," – Herod – reigned for 33 years, 37 BC to 4 BC.

Magi – our modern word "magistrate" is derived from the word "Magi." These professionals were brilliant and highly educated scholars who were trained in <u>medicine</u>, <u>history</u>, <u>religion</u>, <u>prophecy</u> and <u>astronomy</u>.

"from the east," – Babylon or Persia; "Oriental Scientists." While they were not kings themselves, you could call them "Kingmakers."

"arrived in Jerusalem," – At a minimum full military escort along with their servants. The total party more than 300 people.

Matthew 2:2 – "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews?" – Isaiah 9:6-7, Daniel 9 – They understood that the Messiah would come to save the Jews.

"For we saw His star in the east," – Could have been the prophecy of Balaam, Numbers 24:17.

"in the east," – Babylon or Persia; that means at least over 1000 miles; that it could have taken up to 2 years for them to arrive.

"and have come to worship Him." – These men were seeking God.

Many passages in the Bible encourage us to seek God and promise that we will find Him!

Isaiah 55:6; Jeremiah 29:13; Zephaniah 2:3; Amos 5:6; Matthew 7:7-8

God tells us to seek Him because He is accessible to us. God is not hard to find and is not hiding from us.

Matthew 2:3 – "he was troubled," – Literally, "to agitate." "and all Jerusalem with him." – Herod was a man that would never live with a rival.

Herod was a descendant of Esau, Genesis 25:19-34. Spiritual versus the flesh, the godly versus the worldly.

"all Jerusalem with him." – Why would Jerusalem be troubled? Another king could disrupt the system in place.

Matthew 2:4 – "all the chief priests" – the ruling party; Sanhedrin the Jewish supreme court.

"and scribes" – these were the experts of the Law. They were the theologians.

Matthew 2:5 – "Bethlehem" – "House of bread," John 6:35.

From Jerusalem to Bethlehem is about 5 miles South! What good is Bible prophecy if it does not lead to action?

Matthew 2:6

700-year-old prophecy, Micah 5:2. Religious leaders <u>interpreted this</u> passage as literal.

Matthew 2:7 – "and determined from them the exact time the star appeared." – Matthew 2:16.

Matthew 2:8-9

"until it came and stood over the place where the Child was." – How does a star stand over a house? "By God!"

Matthew 2:10

2. Verses 11-12 – The Wise Will Find Him:

Matthew 2:11 – "After coming into the <u>house</u>" – Notice that the family was in a house not a stable.

"they saw the <u>Child</u> with Mary His mother;" – Note "Child" – "little child," 1 to 2 years of age.

"and they fell to the ground and worshiped Him." – Worshiped – "to fall upon the knees and touch the ground with the forehead as an expression of profound reverence."

"they presented to Him gifts" – Gift's were symbolic but gifts fit for a King.

"Gold" – Deity Of Jesus; Gold, most precious of metals; a gift fit for a King. Matthew, Gospel; Jesus the King. Jesus is the King of Kings.

"Frankincense" – Ministry Of Jesus; Used by the priest in sacrifice. Jesus is our High Priest. Jesus' life was a sweet fragrance to God. He lived a perfect life.

"Myrrh" – Humanity Of Jesus; Used to embalm the dead. Jesus is the lamb sacrificed before the foundation of the world.

These gifts were a result of Divine Revelation and great love.

Application:

- 1. God Encourages Us To Seek Him Because He Is Accessible To All. God Is Not Difficult To Find If We Will Seek Him With All Of Our Heart: Jeremiah 29:13.
- 2. The Wise Men Teach Us That True Wisdom Is Not Based Upon One's IQ Nor Education But One's Actions To Seek And Worship Jesus: Isaiah 55:6.
