1. Should We Study The Ten Commandments?

We Should Study The Ten Commandments:

- 1. We Are Living In A Time Of Moral Decline
- 2. Because Of Ignorance
- 3. Crisis In Ethics

Relativism – "knowledge, truth, and morality exist in relation to culture, society, or historical context, and are not absolute."

- **4. Law Invites Grace** Israel had become a nation by God. God had delivered them supernaturally. After seeing all that God had done, we should love to obey Him, Exodus 20:1-2.
- **5. Law Invites Gospel –** The Law exposes how sinful we are, Ecclesiastes 12:13.

In a society where God is rejected, the society looks at people as <u>things</u> not <u>persons</u>. **Reverence for God and respect for man must go together**.

2. Should We Obey The Ten Commandments?

Exodus 20:1-2

3 Reasons Why We Should Obey The Ten Commandments:

1. Divine Authority – God Spoke These Words: "God spoke all these words," – These sayings are not from man but through God! They are divine!

Deuteronomy 8:3

2. Directives – God-Given Commandments: Commandments Are The Perfect Expression of His Love.

In The Hebrew, they are called, "The Ten Words" or "The Decalogue."

These "Ten Words" or Commandments are universal.

Romans 8:4

3. Permanent - Written On Stone, They Will Not Change.

"The Universal Foundation For All Ethics;" Basic law of human conduct in society.

Romans 6:14-15 – The context: Paul said we gave ourselves with everything when in the world, now give all to God for righteousness!

Matthew 5:17

Romans 6:1-2

3. The Background For The Commandments:

Exodus 19:1-3 – It has been three months; God wants to speak a message to His people.

Exodus 19:4-6 – God Renews His Covenant With His People.

Deuteronomy 6:5-6 – Love God through obedience!

The foundation for the whole Law itself is "The Ten Commandments, The Ten Words of God, The Decalogue." – "There can be no community without law."

4. The Purpose Of The Ten Commandments:

There are 3 important purposes for the Ten Commandments:

- **1. The Law Reveals The Character of God:** God is holy; He does not change, Exodus 19.
- 2. The Law Expresses God's Will.
- 3. To Convince Us That We Are Sinners; That We Need A Savior.

Sin – is missing the mark. That is God's standard.

Romans 3:23 - "for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,"

5. The Ten Commandments:

The Commandments on the First Tablet of Stone, 1-4, Deal with our relationship to God.

The Commandments on the Second Tablet of Stone, 5-10, Deal with our relationship to Man.

Matthew 22:36-38 – Our relationship to God Matthew 22:39-40 – Our relationship to Man

<u>Commandment #1 (Loving God)</u> – Exodus 20:3 – This speaks of the Preeminence of God.

Positive - You will have God!

Commandment #2 (The Invisible God) - Exodus 20:4-6

Positive – We have the written Word of God, and the living Word of God.

Commandment #3 (In The Name Of God) - Exodus 20:7

Positive – Hallowed be your name. We need to reverence His name; will elevate our ground for loving Him.

Commandment #4 (Time) - Exodus 20:8-11

Positive – We can set aside time for the one we love; Invest time in Him, worship with others.

Commandment #5 (Parents) – Exodus 20:12

God says be <u>obedient to parents in the growing years</u>, and <u>respect in the mature years</u>.

Positive – Well-being, long life, rich national grace, a social treasure.

Commandment #6 (Life Is Sacred) – Exodus 20:13

Positive – Need to work out offenses so that we don't develop hatred and malice.

Commandment #7 (Men, Women and God) - Exodus 20:14

Positive – The blessing of loving your spouse, your children, your neighbors, the Church.

Commandment #8 (Property) – Exodus 20:15

Positive – Respecting others property.

Commandment #9 (Truth) - Exodus 20:16

Positive – Speaking the truth in love brings glory to God, family, Church and society.

Commandment #10 (Wrong Desire) - Exodus 20:17

Positive – It brings us to our knees; that we come to God and see self as we are and we covet the blessing of others. Covet – Shall be content.

James 2:10
